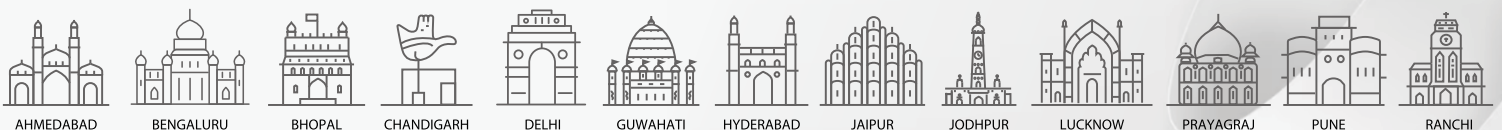



# 1. INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

## 1.1 India and Neighbourhood





## 1. Bangladesh (Capital: Dhaka)

- ▶ **Context:** Fifth Annual Defence Dialogue was recently held between India and Bangladesh in Dhaka (Bangladesh).
- ▶ **Land borders:** India (4096 km border with Indian states of West Bengal, Assam, Meghalaya, Tripura and Mizoram), Myanmar (southeast).
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Bay of Bengal
- ▶ **Other fact:** Home to Sundarbans mangrove forest, one of the largest such forests in the world (140,000 ha)



## 2. Sri Lanka (Legislative capital: Sri Jayawardenepura Kotte and Executive and Judicial capital: Colombo)

- ▶ **Context:** India and Sri Lanka marked their 75th anniversary of diplomatic relations in 2023.
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Island country lying in Indian Ocean and separated from peninsular India by Palk Strait.
- ▶ **Other Facts:**
  - ▶ Ashoka sent his children Mahendra and Sangamitta to spread the teachings of Lord Buddha at the request of King Devanampiya Tissa of Sri Lanka.
  - ▶ Two-thirds of the world's oil and half of the world's container transportation passes through the south of Sri Lanka.



## 3. Malaysia (Capital: Kuala Lumpur)

- ▶ **Context:** India and Malaysia have agreed to settle trade in Indian rupees in addition to current modes of settlement in other currencies.
- ▶ **Land Borders:** Thailand (north), Singapore (south), Indonesia (southwest) and Brunei.
- ▶ **Malaysia consists of two non-contiguous regions:** Peninsular Malaysia (West Malaysia) located in Malay Peninsula, and East Malaysia (Malaysia Timur), which is on island of Borneo.
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** South China Sea (north), Strait of Malacca (west), Sulu Sea (northeast), and the Celebes sea (southeast).
- ▶ **Other facts:** Malaysia has allowed Visa free entry for Indians for stay up to 30 days.





#### 4. Philippines (Capital: Manila)

- ▶ **Context:** India and Philippines during 5th meeting of the **Joint Commission on Bilateral Cooperation (JCBC)** decided to expand their defence partnership.
- ▶ **Water Bodies:**
  - ▶ Philippines is an archipelago (of over 7,000 islands) in south-eastern Asia between the South China Sea and the Pacific Ocean.
  - ▶ It is **divided into three island groups:** Luzon (largest island of country), Visayas, and Mindanao.
  - ▶ Bounded by Philippine Sea, Celebes Sea, Sulu Sea and South China Sea.



#### 5. Lao PDR or Laos (Capital: Vientiane)

- ▶ **Context:** Five MoUs were signed between India & Laos for the implementation of five Quick Impact Projects (QIPs) in the fields of education, health, water facility and IT.
- ▶ **Land Borders:** China(north), Vietnam (northeast and east), Cambodia (south), Thailand (west), and Myanmar(northwest).



#### 6. Vietnam (Capital: Hanoi)

- ▶ **Context:** Recently India and Vietnam reiterated commitment to deepen strategic partnership.
- ▶ **Land Borders:** China (North), Laos and Cambodia (West)
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** The South China Sea (East and South).



## 1.2 Bilateral Exchanges

### Saudi Arabia (Capital: Riyadh)

- ▶ **Context:** Indian prime minister and Saudi crown prince co-chaired the first summit-level meeting of the **India-Saudi Arabia Strategic Partnership Council (SPC)**.
- ▶ **Land Borders:**
  - ▶ Jordan, Iraq, and Kuwait (north), Qatar, UAE, and Oman (east); Yemen (south and southwest).
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Red Sea and the Gulf of Aqaba (west) and Persian Gulf (east).
- ▶ **Other Facts:**
  - ▶ The country **occupies about four-fifths of the Arabian Peninsula**.
  - ▶ Arabian Peninsula **contains the world's largest sand area, the Rub al-Khali** ("Empty Quarter").
  - ▶ **Site of that Islam's holiest cities, Mecca and Medina.**
  - ▶ To the east, along the Persian Gulf, are the country's **abundant oil fields**.



### UAE (Capital: Abu Dhabi)

- ▶ **Context:** India-UAE **Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) completed one year**. Also, Union Cabinet recently approved **Bilateral Investment Treaty** with UAE.
- ▶ **Land Borders:** Saudi Arabia (west and south) and Oman (east and northeast).
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Persian Gulf (west), Strait of Hormuz and Gulf of Oman (east).
- ▶ **Other Facts:**
  - ▶ UAE is the **federation of seven emirates** : Abu Dhabi(largest), Dubai, Sharjah, Ajman, Umm Al Quwain, Ras Al Khaimah and Fujairah.
  - ▶ Some of the **world's largest sand dunes are located east of 'Arādah** in the oases of Līwā.
  - ▶ Important oases are at **Al-Ain, east of Abu Dhabi**.



## Armenia (Capital: Yerevan)

- ▶ **Context:** Union Cabinet approved the MoU with Armenia on Cooperation in the **field of sharing successful Digital Solutions** implemented at Population Scale for Digital Transformation.
- ▶ **Land Borders:** Azerbaijan, Nagorno-Karabakh Republic (a disputed territory), Turkey, Nakhchivan Autonomous Republic (an exclave of Azerbaijan), Georgia, and Iran.
- ▶ **Other fact:** Landlocked country of Transcaucasia (populated region to the south of the Caucasus Mountains).



## The United States (Capital: Washington, D.C)

- ▶ **Context:** Indian PM visited the US on **3<sup>rd</sup> Official State Visit** (the earlier two state visits happened during 1969 and 2009).
- ▶ **Land borders:**
  - ▶ US includes **48 conterminous states and the state of Alaska, and the island state of Hawaii.**
  - ▶ The conterminous states are bounded by **Canada (north) and Mexico (south).**
- ▶ **Water Bodies:**
  - ▶ Atlantic Ocean (east), Gulf of Mexico (south) and Pacific Ocean (west).
- ▶ **Other facts:**
  - ▶ The US is the **fourth largest country in the world** in area (after Russia, Canada, and China).
  - ▶ Home to the Great Lakes which including Lake Superior, **Lake Huron, Lake Michigan, Lake Erie, and Lake Ontario.**



## Duqm Port

- ▶ **Context:** India's National Security Advisor visited port of Duqm in Oman recently.
- ▶ **Land Borders:** Yemen, Saudi Arabia and UAE
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Arabian Sea, Strait of Hormuz, the Gulf of Oman.
- ▶ **Other Facts:**
  - ▶ India in 2018 secured access Duqm for military use and logistical support.
  - ▶ Port can also provide India an easy access to Red Sea via the Gulf of Aden.



## Brazil (Capital: Brasilia)

- ▶ **Context:** 2023 year marks the 75th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Brazil and India, as well as 20th anniversary of IBSA (India-Brazil-South Africa) forum.



## Panama (Capital: Panama City)

- ▶ **Context:** India and Panama signed MoU on Electoral Cooperation.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Costa Rica and Colombia
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Caribbean Sea (an extension of the Atlantic Ocean) to north and Pacific Ocean to south.





## Suriname (Capital: Paramaribo)

### ► Contexts:

- The Indian President was conferred with the **highest civilian honour of Suriname** 'Grand Order of the Chain of the Yellow Star' on the occasion of 150th anniversary of the arrival of Indians in Suriname.
- In the year 1873, the first group of 399 Indian Indentured Labours reached Suriname, on board the ship Lalla Rookh.
- MoU signed between India and Suriname in the field of the regulation of medicines i.e for Recognition of Indian Pharmacopoeia (IP) in Suriname.
- **Land borders:** French Guiana (east), Brazil (south), and Guyana (west).
- **Water bodies:** Atlantic Ocean.
- **Other fact:** It is one of the top producers of Bauxite in the world.



## Argentina (Capital: Buenos Aires)

### ► Contexts:

- Argentina signs **letter of intent with Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL)** to buy helicopters.
- India signs **Agreement for Lithium Exploration and Mining Project** in Argentina.
- **Land borders:** Chile (south and west), Bolivia and Paraguay (north), and Brazil, Uruguay (east)
- **Water bodies:** Atlantic Ocean (east)



## Trinidad and Tobago (Capital: Port of Spain)

- **Context:** India Signs MoU with Trinidad and Tobago on sharing India Stack(set of open APIs (Application Program Interface) and digital public goods).
- **Land borders:** island country consisting of two main islands—Trinidad and Tobago—and several smaller islands.
- **Water Bodies:** Caribbean Sea and separated from Venezuela by the Gulf of Paria.



## Venezuela (Capital: Caracas)

- ▶ **Context:** India set to resume import of oil from Venezuela after 3 years as US sanctions on Caracas ease.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Guyana, Brazil, and Colombia.
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Caribbean Sea and the Atlantic Ocean.
- ▶ **Other facts:** Home to Lake Maracaibo (largest lake in South America).



## Australia (Capital: Canberra)

- ▶ **Context:** Cabinet approves Mutual Recognition Arrangement (MRA) of Authorised Economic Operators (AEO) between India and Australia.
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Pacific and Indian oceans
- ▶ **Other fact:** It is the smallest continent and one of the largest countries on Earth lying between the in the Southern Hemisphere.



## South Korea (Capital: Seoul)

- ▶ **Context:** 2023 marks 50th anniversary of diplomatic relations between India and South Korea (Republic of Korea or RoK).
- ▶ **Land borders:** North Korea
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Sea of Japan (east), East China Sea (south), Yellow Sea (west); Korea Strait (southeast) which separates it from the Japanese island of Tsushima.



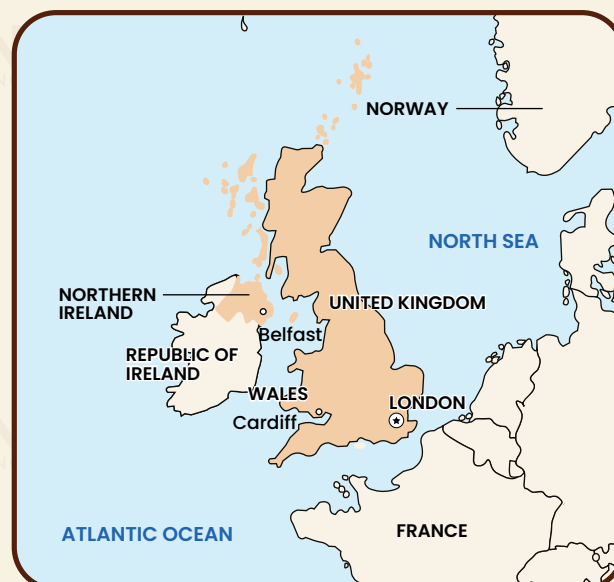
## France (Capital: Paris)

- ▶ **Context:** Marking 25 years of their strategic relations, India and France, launched the Horizon 2047 framework.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Germany and Belgium (north); Spain (south), **Alps, Switzerland** and **Italy** (east).
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Atlantic Ocean (west); and Mediterranean Sea (south)
- ▶ **Other fact:** France is home to Europe's tallest peak -Monte Blanc.



## UK (Capital: London)

- ▶ **Context:** Recently, inaugural India-UK 2+2 Foreign and Defence Dialogue was held in New Delhi to discuss and review all aspects of India-UK Comprehensive Strategic Partnership.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Ireland
- ▶ **Water bodies:** English Channel(south), North Sea (east), Irish Sea (west) and the Atlantic Ocean.
- ▶ **Other facts:**
  - ▶ UK includes England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland.
  - ▶ **Greenwich Meridian** passes through it.



## Italy (Capital: Rome)

- ▶ **Context:** India and Italy signed pact to deepen defence cooperation.
- ▶ **Land borders:** France, Switzerland, Austria, and Slovenia
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Mediterranean Sea, Adriatic Sea (northeast), Ionian Sea (southeast), Tyrrhenian Sea (southwest), and Ligurian Sea (northwest).



## Lithuania (Capital: Vilnius)

- ▶ **Context:** India and Lithuania held a meeting to strengthen maritime bilateral relations.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Latvia(north), Belarus(east and south), Poland and the detached Russian oblast of Kaliningrad (southwest).
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Baltic Sea(west).
- ▶ **Other facts:**
  - ▶ It is the largest of the three Baltic states (**other two Estonia, and Latvia**).
  - ▶ Lithuanian is considered the oldest surviving Indo-European language in the world.



## Egypt (Capital: Cairo)

- ▶ **Context:** 2023 witnessed Indian PM's first State visit to Egypt.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Libya, Gaza Strip, Sudan, and the Asian Sinai Peninsula.
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Red Sea and Mediterranean Sea



## Tanzania (Capital: Dodoma)

- ▶ **Context:** IIT Madras establishes first international campus in Tanzania's Zanzibar.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Uganda, and Kenya (north), Mozambique and Zambia (south and southwest), and Burundi, and Rwanda (west).
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Indian Ocean, Lake Tanganyika (west), Lake Victoria (north), and Lake Malawi (aka Lake Nyasa) and River Congo.





## Guinea-Bissau (Capital: Bissau)

- ▶ **Context:** Guinea-Bissau exports almost the entire cashew crop (around 98 percent) to India for processing.
- ▶ **Land borders:**
  - ▶ **Senegal** (north), **Guinea** (east and south).
  - ▶ It includes **Bijagós (Bissagos) archipelago** and other islands that lie off the coast.
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Atlantic Ocean



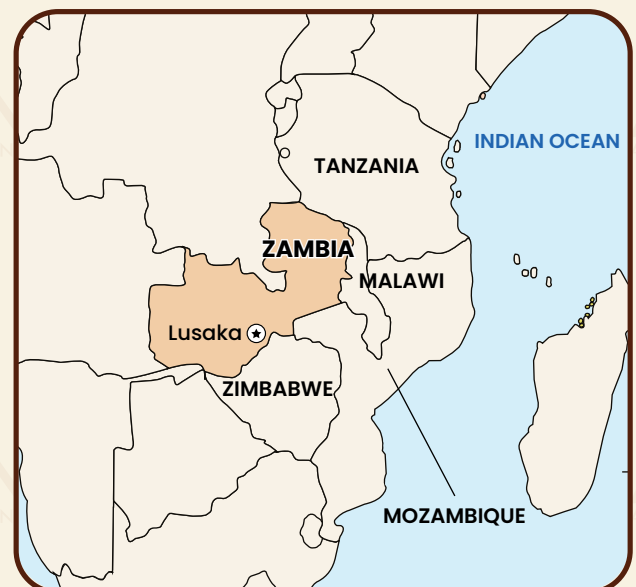
## Malawi (Capital: Lilongwe)

- ▶ **Context:** Parliamentary delegation from Malawi is visited India.
- ▶ **Land borders:** **Tanzania** (north), **Lake Malawi** (east), **Mozambique** (east and south), and **Zambia** (west).
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Lake Malawi (aka Lake Nyasa in Tanzania) (largest), Lake Chilwa.



## Zambia (Capital: Lusaka)

- ▶ **Context:** Indian Defence Secretary held a meeting with Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Defence, Zambia.
- ▶ **Land borders:** **Angola**, **Namibia**, **Botswana**, **Zimbabwe**, **Mozambique**, **Malawi**, **Tanzania** and **DRC**.



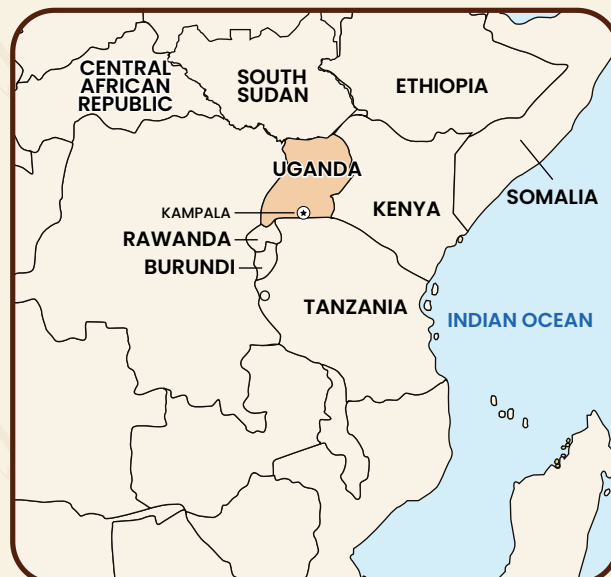
## Benin (Capital: Porto-Novo)

- ▶ **Context:** MEA said India is Benin's largest trade partner and significant investor.
- ▶ **Land border:** Burkina Faso (northwest), Nigeria (east), Togo (west), Niger (North).
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Niger River, Atlantic Ocean



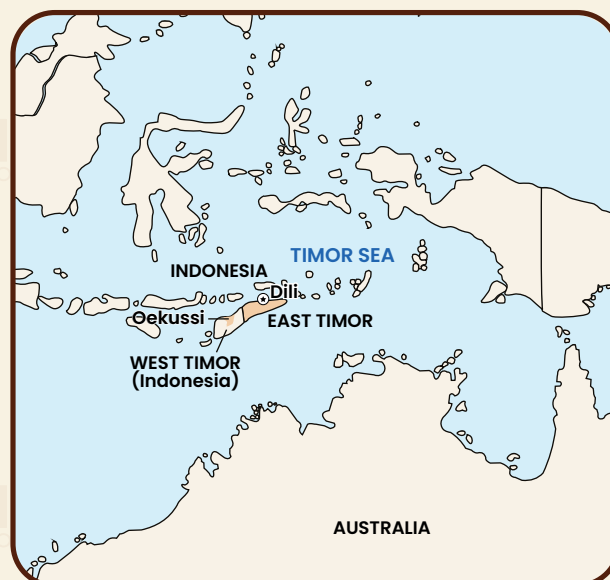
## Uganda (Capital: Kampala)

- ▶ **Context:** Minister of External Affairs visited Uganda.
- ▶ **Land borders:** South Sudan (north), Kenya (east), Tanzania and Rwanda (south), and the Democratic Republic of the Congo (west).
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Lake Victoria



## Timor-Leste (Capital: Dili)

- ▶ **Context:** India has announced the opening of an embassy in Dili.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Western Timor (part of the Indonesian province, in southwest).
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Timor Sea (southeast), the Wetar Strait (north), the Ombai Strait (northwest).

**Major Outcomes:**

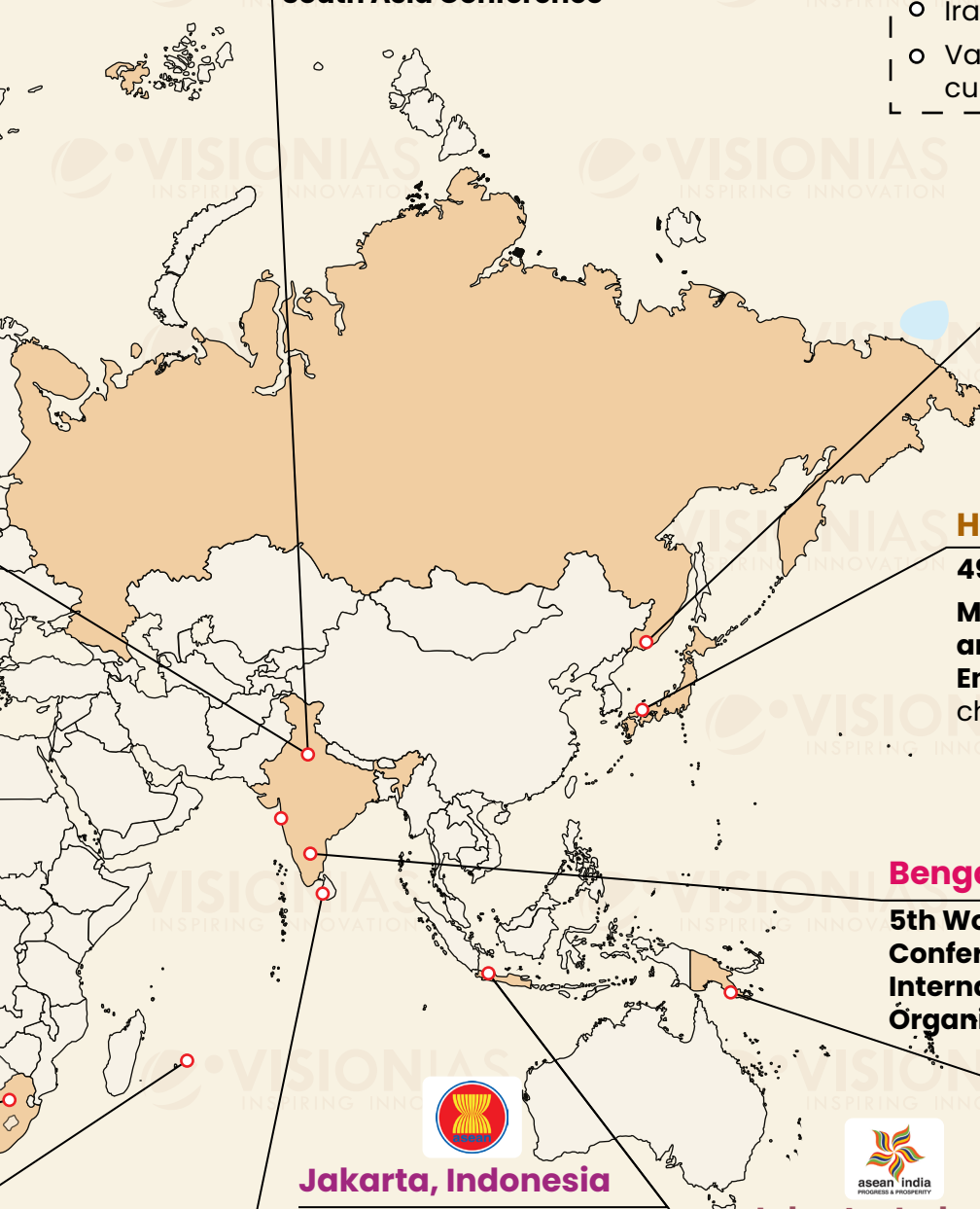

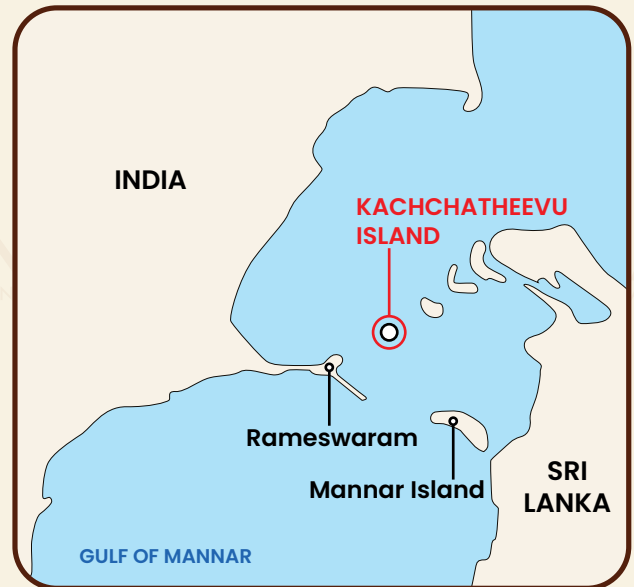

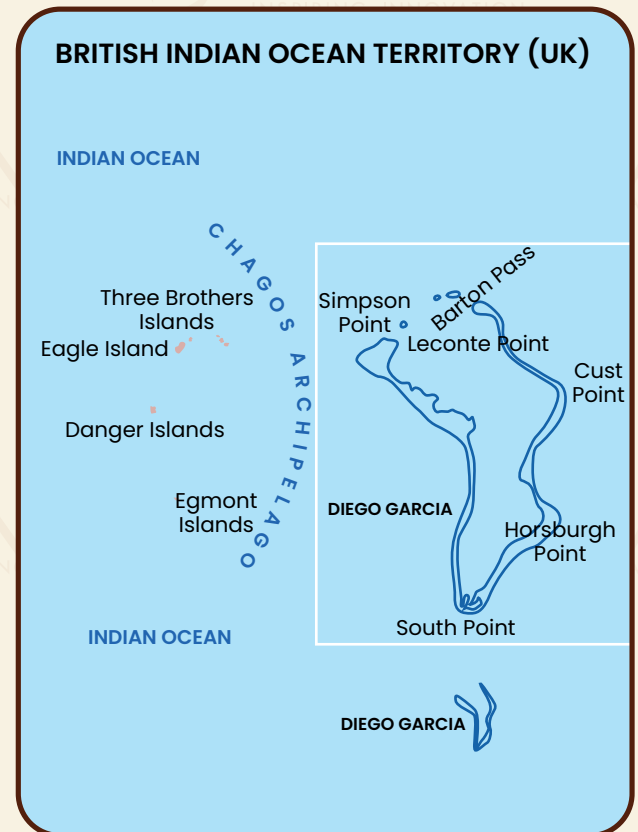
### Katchatheevu Island

- ▶ **Context:** Tamil Nadu Chief Minister revived the debate over Katchatheevu, by reiterating the demand for retrieval from Sri Lanka.
- ▶ **About Katchatheevu**
  - ▶ Katchatheevu is an **uninhabited speck**, between **India and Sri Lanka** in the **Palk Strait**.
  - ▶ It **lies northeast of Rameswaram** (India) and **southwest of Jaffna** (Sri Lanka).
  - ▶ It is **important to the fisherfolks** of the two countries who have been **traditionally using the islet for fishing**.
  - ▶ In 1974, as part of 'Indo-Sri Lankan Maritime agreement', India **ceded Katchatheevu to Sri Lanka**.



### British Indian Ocean Territory (BIOT)

- ▶ **Context:** 32 Indian fishermen have been **detained by the British Navy** for trespassing into the British Indian Ocean Territory (BIOT) while fishing in the high seas.
- ▶ **About BIOT**
  - ▶ BIOT is the **overseas territory of the United Kingdom in the central Indian Ocean**, established in 1965.
  - ▶ Since 1976 it has been **coterminous with the Chagos Archipelago**.
  - ▶ It **constitutes a semicircular group**:
    - ▶ comprising the Salomon Islands, Peros Banhos atoll, Nelsons Island, the Three Brothers Islands, the Eagle Islands, Danger Island, the Egmont Islands, and Diego Garcia atoll.
    - ▶ Diego Garcia Atoll, is the largest and southernmost landmass in the group and the location of a significant U.S. military base.



## Israel (Capital: Jerusalem)

- ▶ **Context:** Israel declared war on Palestine militant group Hamas under **Operation Iron Swords**, following their unprecedented attack under **Operation Toofan Al-Aqsa** (Al-Aqsa Flood).
- ▶ **Land Borders:**
  - ▶ Jordan, Syria, Lebanon, and Egypt.
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Mediterranean Sea, Dead Sea, Jordan River, Sea of Galilee



## Syria (Capital: Damascus)

- ▶ **Context:** Turkiye steps up strikes on militants as conflict escalates in Syria.
- ▶ **Land Borders:**
  - ▶ Turkey (north), Iraq (southeast), Jordan (south), Lebanon and Israel (southwest).
  - ▶ Its area includes territory in the **Golan Heights** that has been occupied by Israel since 1967.
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Mediterranean Sea



## Nagorno-Karabakh Region

- ▶ **Context:** India supports **OSCE Minsk Group** for a peaceful resolution of the **conflict between Armenia and Azerbaijan** over **Nagorno-Karabakh region**.
- ▶ **OSCE** is the **world's largest regional security organization** with **57 participating states**.
- ▶ The **Minsk Group** was **created in 1994** to address the dispute and is co-chaired by the United States, France, and Russia.
- ▶ **Land Borders:** It is a **landlocked mountainous area** in South Caucasus.
- ▶ **Other Facts:**
  - ▶ The region is referred to as **Artsakh** by Armenians and was claimed by both Azerbaijan and Armenia after the fall of the Russian Empire in 1917.
  - ▶ The territory is recognised as part of Azerbaijan, but its inhabitants are predominantly ethnic Armenians.



## Senegal (Capital: Dakar)

- ▶ **Context:** Recently witnessed clashes.
- ▶ **Land borders:** **Mali** (east); **Guinea and Guinea-Bissau** (south) **Gambia** (west)
- ▶ **Water bodies:** **Sénégal River** (north and northeast), **Atlantic Ocean** (west).
- ▶ **Other fact:** It lies in **depression known as Senegal-Mauritanian Basin**.





## Ethiopia (Capital: Addis Ababa)

- ▶ **Context:**
  - ▶ Ethiopia's government has declared a **state of emergency** in its second-largest region, Amhara.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Eritrea (north), Djibouti (northeast), Somalia (east), Kenya (south), South Sudan and Sudan (west).
- ▶ **Other facts:**
  - ▶ Landlocked country on Horn of Africa.
  - ▶ Largest and most populated country in Horn of Africa.



## Nigeria (Capital: Abuja)

- ▶ **Context:**
  - ▶ Indian Defence Minister attended the swearing in ceremony of Nigerian President.
  - ▶ Nigeria has declared a **State of Emergency over Food Security**.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Niger (north), Chad and Cameroon (east), Benin (west).
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Gulf of Guinea
- ▶ **Other fact:** Often called as **Giant of Africa**.



## Sudan (Capital: Khartoum)

- ▶ **Context:** Heavy fighting raged across Khartoum.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Egypt, Libya, Chad, Central African Republic, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea.
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Red Sea.



## Niger (Capital: Niamey)

- ▶ **Context:** Military seized power in Niger.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Algeria (northwest), Libya (northeast), Chad (east), Nigeria and Benin (south), Burkina Faso and Mali (west).
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Niger River (3rd-longest river in Africa after the Nile and Congo rivers).



## Libya (Capital: Tripoli)

- ▶ **Context:** Clashes between two leading armed groups in Tripoli, only civilian airport, have led to its closure.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Egypt (east), Sudan (southeast), Niger and Chad (south), and Tunisia and Algeria (west).
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Mediterranean Sea
- ▶ **Other Facts:** Ghibli - a hot arid wind blows from south over entire country.



## Gabon (Capital-Libreville)

- ▶ **Context:** Gabon military officers declare coup after president wins disputed election.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Equatorial Guinea, Cameroon, and the Republic of the Congo.
- ▶ **Water Bodies:** Atlantic Ocean (west)
- ▶ **Other Facts :** It is a country at the Equator.



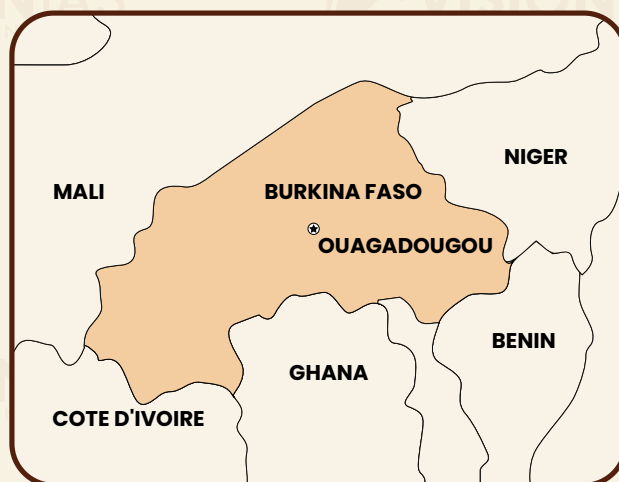
## Sahel Region

- ▶ **Context:** Three Sahel nations—Mali, Burkina Faso and Niger— have signed a defence pact to cooperate against threats of armed rebellion or external aggression.
- ▶ **About Sahel Region**
  - ▶ It is a **semi-arid region of western and north-central Africa** that stretches from **Atlantic Ocean to the Red Sea** along Sahara desert's southern rim.
  - ▶ **Countries:** Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Chad, Gambia, Guinea Mauritania, Mali, Niger, Nigeria and Senegal.
  - ▶ It forms a **transitional zone between Sahara desert** to the north and **savannas to the south**.



## Burkina Faso (Capital: Ouagadougou)

- ▶ **Context:** Burkina Faso orders the French embassy's defense attache to leave.
- ▶ **Land borders:** Mali(north and west), Niger(northeast), Benin(southeast), and Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, and Togo(south).



## Canada (Capital: Ottawa)

- ▶ **Context:** Diplomatic tensions flared between Canada and India following the Canadian PM's accusation that Indian agents were involved in the murder of Sikh separatist leader in Canada.
- ▶ **Land borders:** United States (south), Greenland (northeast) and the U.S. state of Alaska (west).
- ▶ **Water bodies:** Pacific Ocean(west), Arctic Ocean (north) Atlantic Ocean (east).
- ▶ **Other facts:**
  - ▶ Canada is the **second largest country in the world in area** (after Russia).
  - ▶ Largest of Canada's physiographic regions is the **Canadian Shield**.



## Ecuador (Capital: Quito)

- ▶ **Context:** Emergency has been imposed due to the assassination of a political leader.
- ▶ **Political Boundaries:** **Colombia** (north), **Peru** (east and south)
- ▶ **Water bodies:** **Pacific Ocean** (west).

### Other facts:

- ▶ **Galapagos Islands** come under its jurisdiction.
- ▶ **Occupies part of the Amazon basin** and is situated on the **Equator**.



## Guyana (Capital: Georgetown)

- ▶ **Water bodies:** Atlantic Ocean (north)

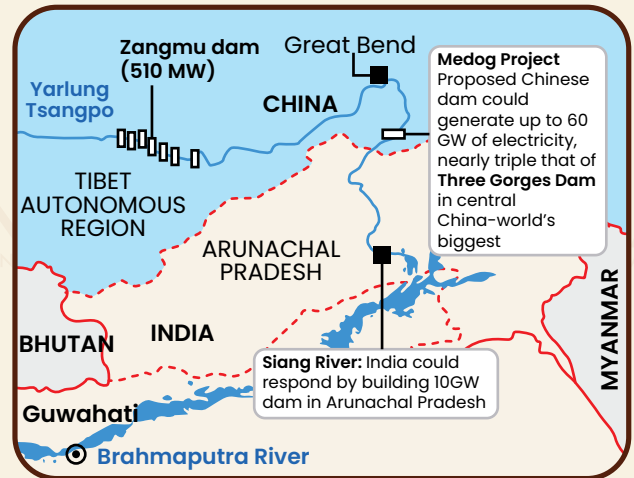

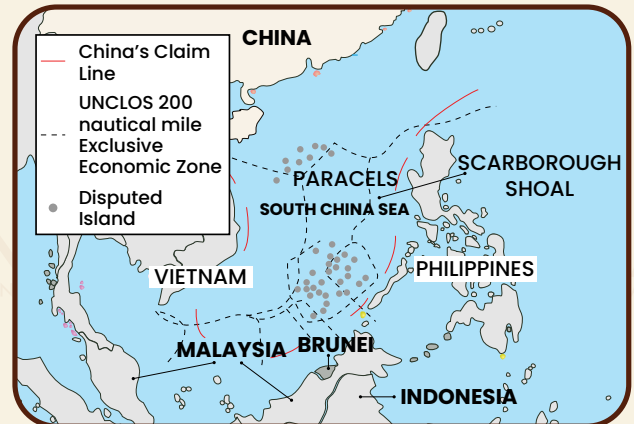

  - ▶ **India-bound cargo ship hijacked** by Houthi rebels in Red Sea.
- ▶ An **inlet of Indian Ocean** between **Africa and Asia**.
- ▶ **Boundary countries** are **Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Yemen, Sudan, Eritrea and Djibouti**.
- ▶ Occupies a **part of Great Rift Valley** (Afro-Arabian Rift Valley).

**Context:** Centre approved setting up a cheetah breeding and conservation centre.

- › **Kutch Desert W.S.** and **Chhari Dhand Conservation Reserve** part of it

### Kadalundi Vallikunnu Community Reserve, Kerala



**Context:** Shrinking mudflat ecosystem of Kadalundi river keeping shorebirds away.

- › India's 1st **river front community reserve**

### Parambikulam reserve, Kerala



**Context:** Kerala HC ordered translocation of wild tusks here.

- › Lies between Anamalai and Nelliampathy hills
- › Houses **one of world's largest and oldest teak tree**- Kannimara

### Eravikulam National Park, Kerala



**Context:** Got its first fernarium.

- › **Anamudi peak** (South India's highest peak) situated on its south
- › Houses special **Neelakurinji flowers** (blooms once every 12 years)

### Bura Chapori Wildlife Sanctuary, Assam



**Context:** Rhinoceros returned after 40 years

- › Notified **buffer zone of Kazairanga T.R.**
- › **Important Bird Area**

### Debrigarh Wildlife Sanctuary, Odisha



**Context:** High prey density recorded

- › Located near **reservoir of Hirakud Dam (Mahanadi River)**

### The Gulf of Mannar Biosphere Reserve, Tamil Nadu



**Context:** Prosopis Chilensis (invasive species) threatening native vegetation

- › **1st Marine Biosphere Reserve** in South and South-East Asia.
- › Has 3 distinct Coastal ecosystems i.e. **coral reef, seagrass bed and mangroves**

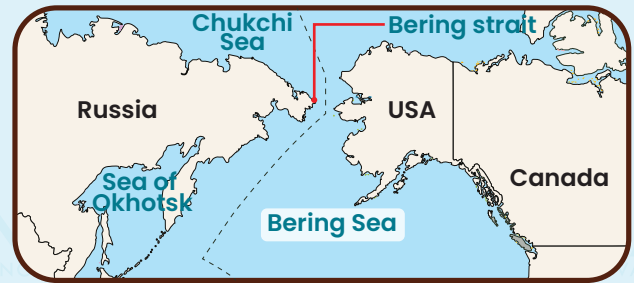

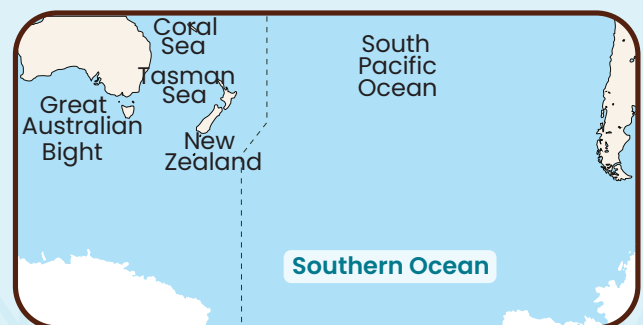

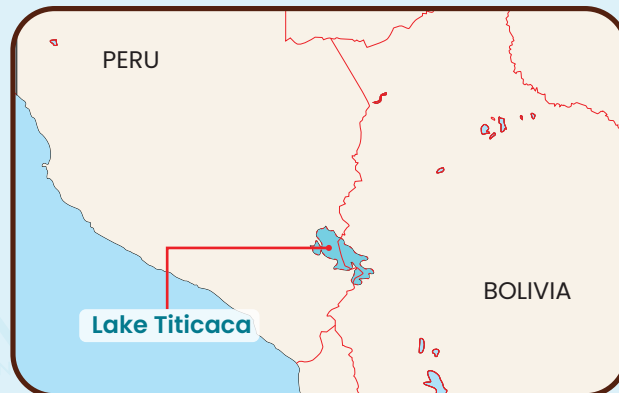

## Mekong River

- ▶ **Context:** A dam project on the river threatens World Heritage Site status of a downstream town in Laos
  - ▶ World's **12th longest** river
  - ▶ **Longest river in S.E Asia.**
  - ▶ Flows through **China, Myanmar, Thailand, Lao PDR, Cambodia** and **Vietnam**

- Consists of 2 contiguous human-made reservoirs- **Bhojtal and Chhota Talaab**
- **Ramsar Site**
- **Important Bird Area**

### Vembanad Kole Wetland, Kerala

**Context:** Pink Bloom, an invasive alien species, flowering massively.

- **Ramsar Site**
- Kerala’s famous **Annual Boat race** held here

### Pulicat lake, Andhra Pradesh

**Context:** Lesser flamingos found after 6 years.

- Lies between Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh
- **Sriharikota island** separates it from Bay of Bengal
- **Annual Flamingo festival** celebrated here

### Pangong Tso lake, Ladakh

**Context:** Both India and China are ramping up infrastructure on its north bank

- **World’s highest salt water lake**
- **1/3rd Lake lies in India** and other 2/3rd in China

### Kanwar lake (or Kabartal Wetland), Bihar

**Context:** Threat of running dry.

- **Ramsar site**
- **Oxbow lake**, formed from **Gandak river** (tributary of Ganga)

### Deepor Beel, Assam

**Context:** Water sports and tourism-related activities being intended.

- **Permanent freshwater lake** formed in former channel of Brahmaputra
- **Ramsar Site**
- **Important bird area**

### Palak Lake, Mizoram

**Context:** Nature walk organized as part of LiFE initiative.

- Largest lake in Mizoram
- **Ramsar site**
- **Important bird area**

### Chilika Lake, Odisha

**Context:** 88 Bird species were found during annual summer survey

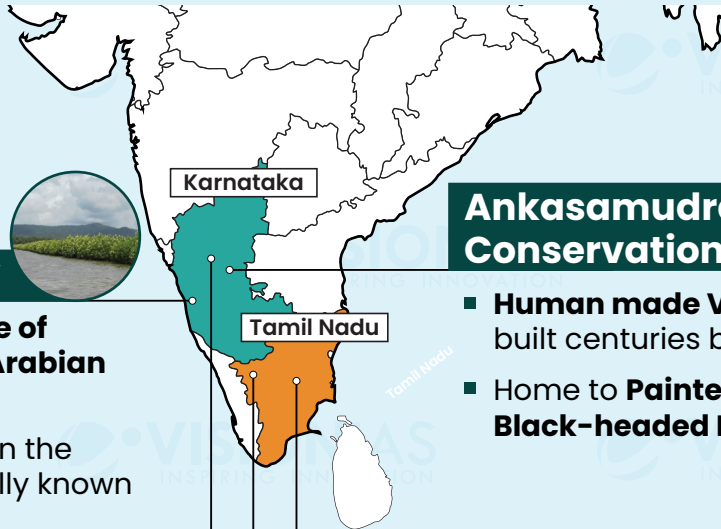

## 4.1 World

### Bletchley Declaration (United Kingdom)

Adopted at World's **first-ever AI Safety Summit**, recognises AI's potential to enhance human well-being as well as risks posed by AI including frontier AI.

### White Hydrogen (France)

Large reservoir of white hydrogen has been discovered. It is also referred to as "natural," "gold" or "geologic" hydrogen.

### OSIRIS-REX (US)

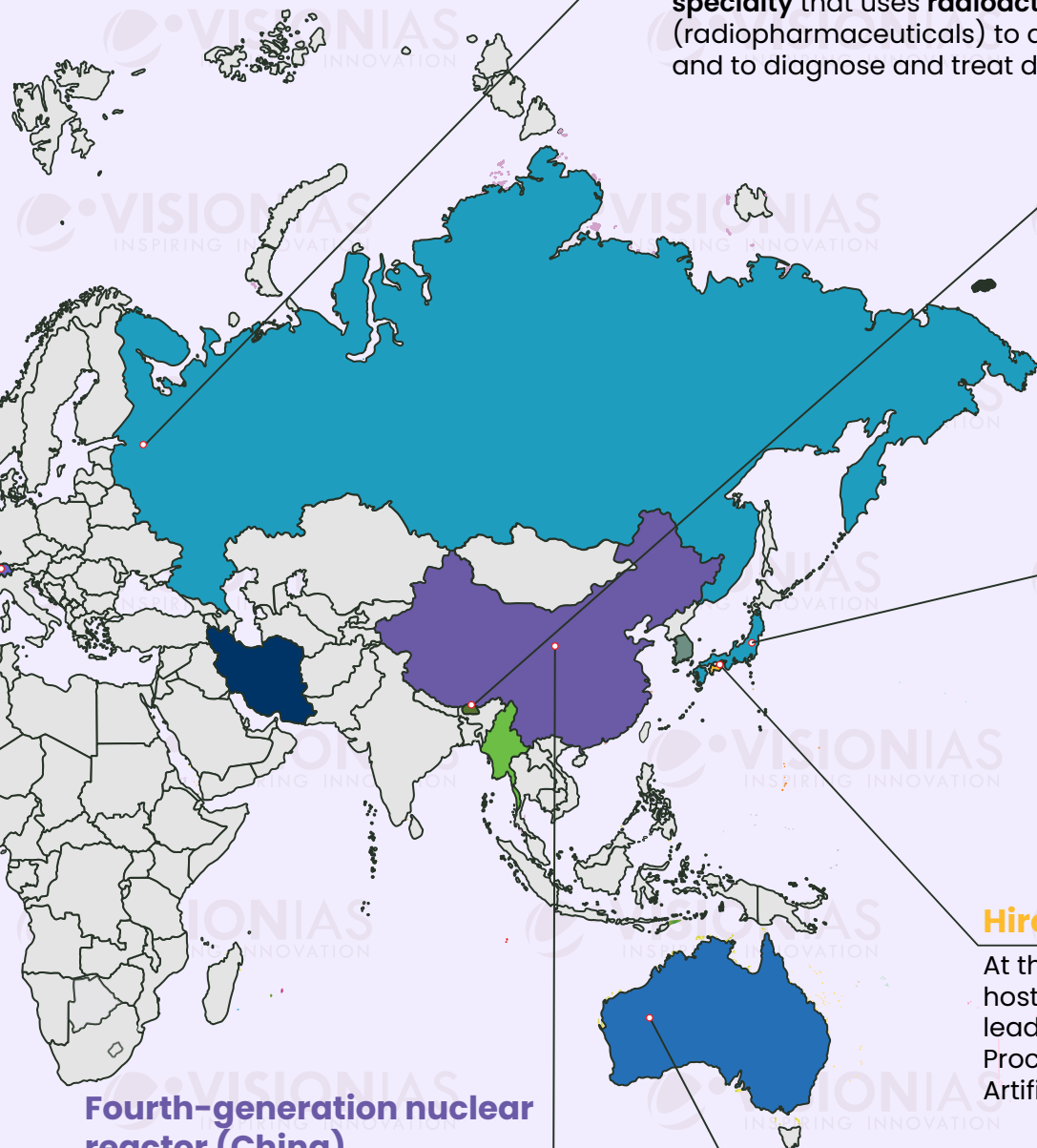
NASA's OSIRIS-Rex (Origins, Spectral Interpretation, Resource Identification, Security- Regolith Explorer), asteroid samples capsule from asteroid Benu lands on Earth.

### CERN (Switzerland)

Evidence of the Higgs boson decaying into Z boson and a photon at The European Organization for Nuclear Research (CERN).

### IceCube Neutrino Observatory (Antarctica)

Neutrinos have been observed with the help of IceCube Neutrino Observatory. It is the **first detector** of its kind, designed to observe the cosmos from deep within the South Pole ice and searches for neutrinos.



### Nuclear Medicine (Russia)

Russia undertook an initiative **Nuclear Medicine** for BRICS collaboration. Nuclear Medicine a **medical specialty** that uses **radioactive tracers** (radiopharmaceuticals) to assess bodily functions and to diagnose and treat disease.

### Crypto mining operations (Bhutan)

Bhutan and Singapore-based Bitdeer have announced plans to **raise \$500 million to set up crypto mining operations in the Himalayas**, tapping into Bhutan's abundant hydroelectric power.

### JT-60SA (Japan)

World's biggest experimental nuclear fusion reactor, forerunner for under-construction **International Thermonuclear Experimental Reactor (ITER)**.

### Hiroshima (Japan)

At the recent G7 summit, hosted by Japan, leaders-initiated Hiroshima AI Process (HAP) to regulate Artificial Intelligence (AI).

### Fourth-generation nuclear reactor (China)

China starts world's first **fourth-generation nuclear reactor (small modular reactors, or SMRs)**. SMRs are advanced nuclear reactors that have a power capacity of up to 300 MW(e) per unit.

### Monoclonal antibodies (mAbs) (Australia)

India decided to **procure doses of Monoclonal Antibody from Australia**. Monoclonal antibodies (mAbs) are **artificial antibodies** that mimic the activity of our immune systems.

## 4.2 India

### Vanadium (Gujarat)

- » Vanadium has been found in sediment collected from **Gulf of Khambhat**, Gujarat. Vanadium is a scarce element, hard, silvery grey, ductile and malleable transition metal.

### Kakrapar-4 (Gujarat)

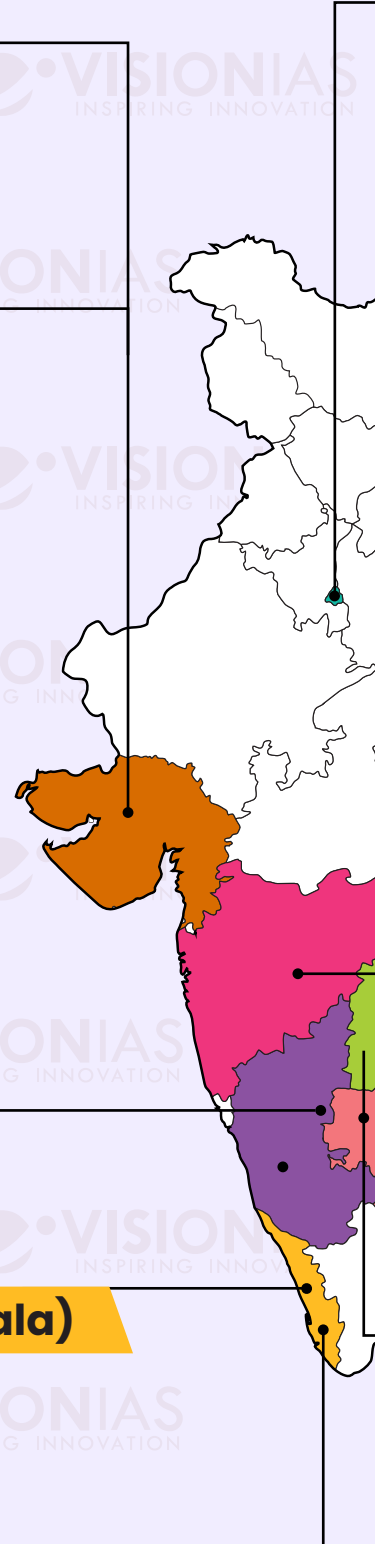
- » Kakrapar-4 nuclear reactor attained criticality.
  - » Criticality refers to a condition in nuclear reactor operations where the number of neutrons produced by fission reactions is sufficient to sustain a self-sustaining chain reaction.

### 3D printed Post Office (Karnataka)

- » **India's first 3D printed post office** has been inaugurated in Bengaluru. 3D printing is an **additive manufacturing (AM) process** that involves printing small layers of material and then fusing them together to form a physical product.

### India Innovation Centre for Graphene (IICG) (Kerala)

- » **India's first** Graphene Centre "India Innovation Centre for Graphene (IICG) has been set up in Kochi. **IICG** aims to foster R&D, product innovation and capacity building in the area of Graphene and 2D material systems.





## New Delhi Declaration (New Delhi)

- » At the Global Partnership on Artificial Intelligence (GPAI) summit, New Delhi Declaration was adopted. Declaration aims **to mitigate risks** (unemployment, lack of transparency etc.) arising from **Artificial Intelligence (AI)** systems.

## Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) (Chhattisgarh)

- » Solar Energy Corporation of India Limited (SECI) successfully commissioned India's largest **BESS**, which stores energy using solar energy. BESS is categorized under the electrochemical storage system which uses different electrochemical reactions to store electricity.

## LIGO-India (Maharashtra)

- » Cabinet approved **Laser Interferometer Gravitational-wave Observatories (LIGO)-India, gravitational-wave detector** to be built in Hingoli.

## Robotics Framework (Telangana)

- » Telangana has become the **first state** in the country to launch **a state robotics framework** with a vision to create a sustainable robotics ecosystem.

## Aditya-L1 (Andhra Pradesh)

- » **Aditya-L1**, first Indian **space mission to study sun**, was launched by Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV) - C57 from Sriharikota.

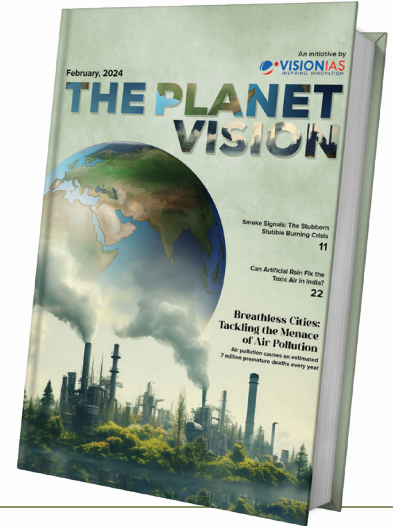
## Nipah Virus (NiV) (Kochi, Kerala)

- » Kerala has witnessed outbreak of NiV.
  - » NiV is a zoonotic virus (transmitted from animals to humans) and can also be transmitted through contaminated food or directly between people.

- Assam is celebrating the auspicious harvest festival of Kati Bihu (aka Kongali Bihu).
- Kati means to cut and this marks the relocation time of rice saplings.



### Hornbill Festival

- 24th edition started in Nagaland.
- US, Germany and Columbia are country partners and Assam is state partner.
- Also known as Festivals of Festivals



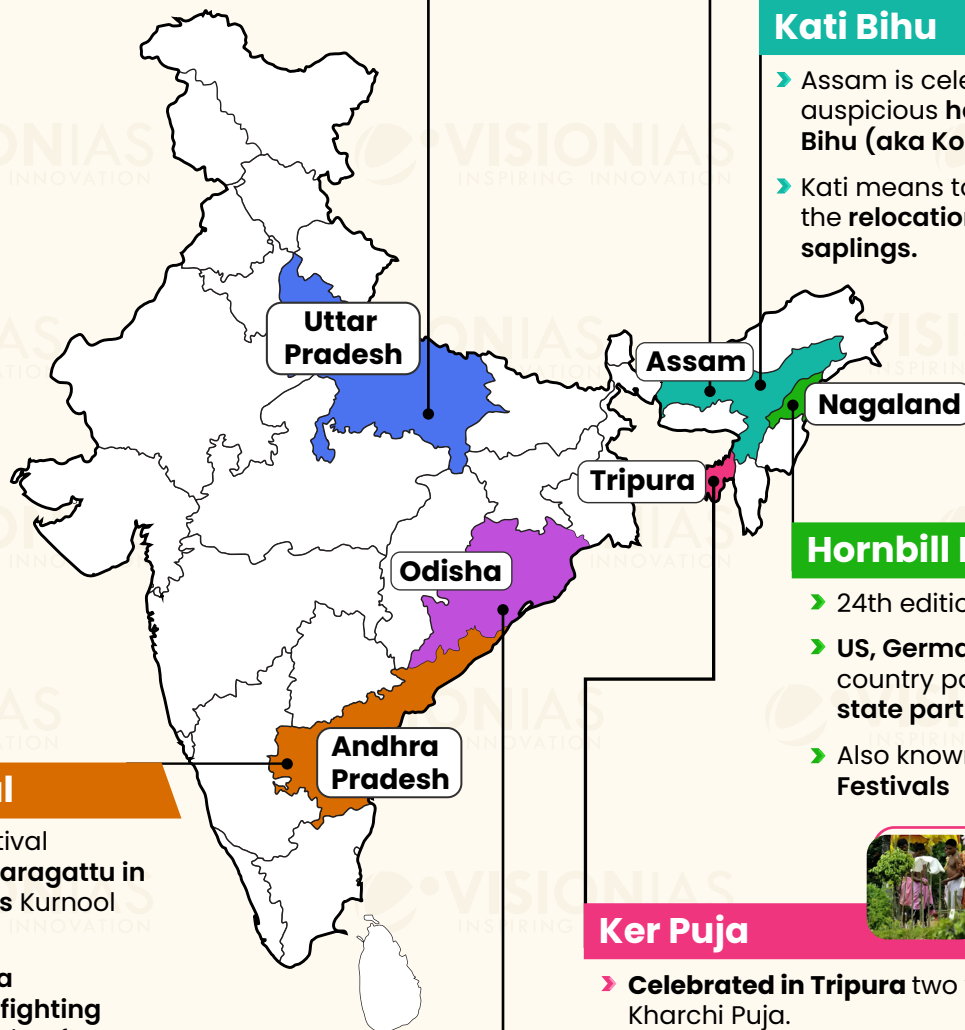
### Ker Puja

### Raja Parba

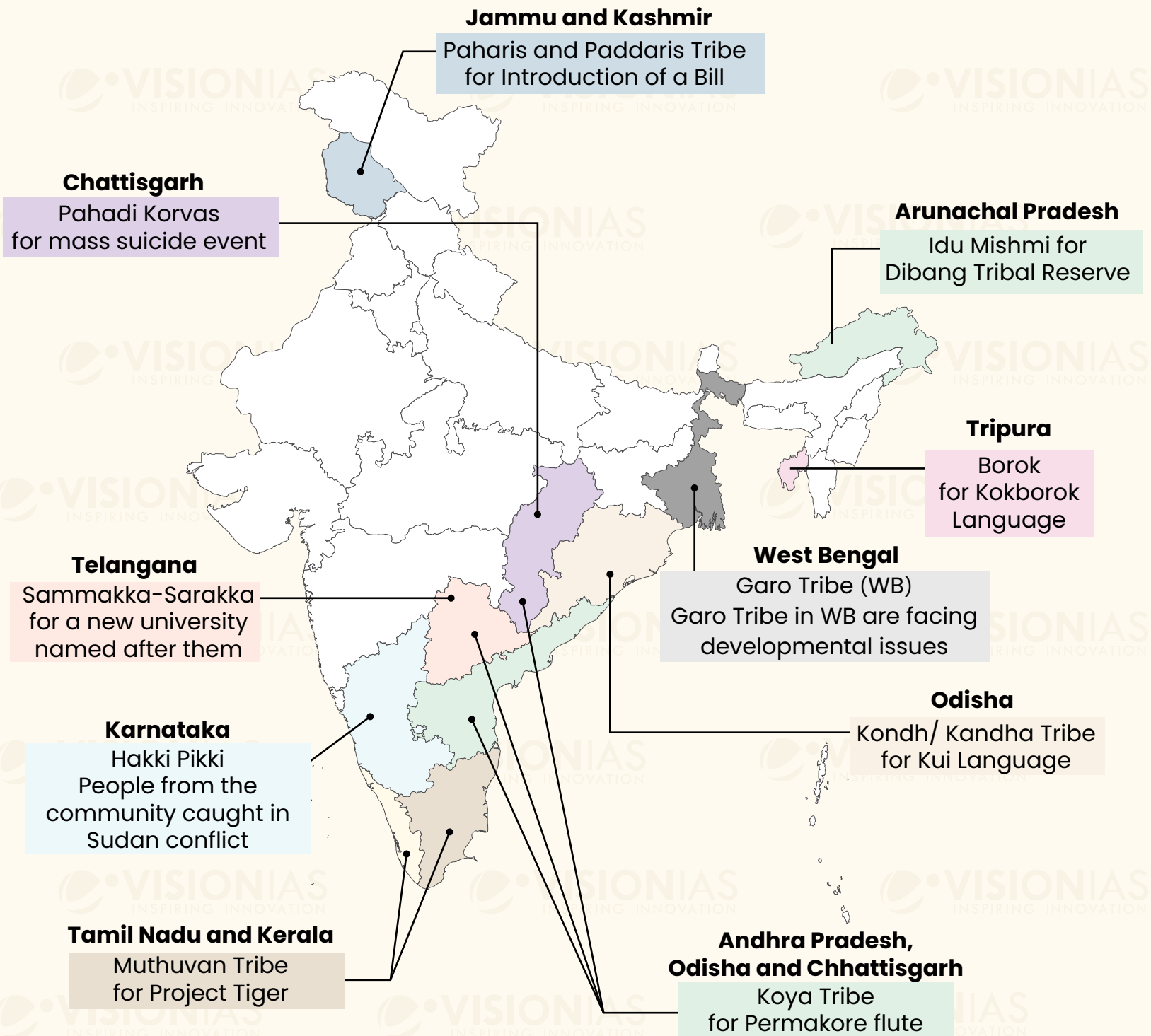
- It is a 3-day festival in Odisha to celebrate womanhood.
