

# Cabinet approved Viability Gap Funding (VGF) scheme for Offshore Wind Energy Projects (OWEP)

With total outlay of Rs. 7,453 crore, VGF scheme provides for commissioning of 1 GW of OWEP (500 MW each off the coast of Gujarat and Tamil Nadu), and upgradation of two ports to meet logistics requirements for these projects.

▶ India is fourth largest wind energy producer in world with cumulative installed capacity of 46.4 GW by May 2024.

#### **About VGF scheme for OWEP**

- ➤ Nodal Ministry: Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE).
- It is a crucial step in implementing National Offshore Wind Energy Policy, 2015 which aims to explore and promote deployment of India's vast offshore wind energy potential within its exclusive economic zone.
- ➤ Private developers will establish projects and Power Grid Corporation of India Ltd. will build the necessary transmission infrastructure like offshore substations.
- Significance of scheme
  - ⊕ Commissioning of 1 GW OWEP will generate approximately 3.72 billion units of renewable electricity annually, reducing CO₂ emissions by 2.98 million tons each year for 25 years.
  - Reduced cost of power from offshore wind projects will make them viable for purchase by DISCOMs.
  - Lead to creation of required ecosystem for development of offshore wind sector further **attracting investments**, **development of indigenous manufacturing capabilities** in this sector.

# Ministry of Coal released Draft Mining Plan Guidelines for Coal and Lignite blocks 2024

These guidelines aim to foster a more sustainable and ethical approach to coal mining.

- ▶ Primary objective is to optimize coal resource extraction through sustainable practices that minimize waste and enhance operational efficiency.
- ➤ Coal Controller Organization (CCO), New Delhi (CCO also has offices at Kolkata, Dhanbad etc.) has been delegated with power of processing, scrutiny and approval of mining plan.
  - CCO (under Ministry of Coal) is major source of Coal Statistics in Government of India and monitors progress of development of Captive Coal/Lignite blocks.
  - It hears any objection to Government's notification relating to acquisition of coal-bearing areas.

#### Key highlights

- All coal/lignite blocks shall have a mining plan approved by competent authority.
- Calendar plan flexibility to allow increased annual coal production.
- Preference for blast-free and continuous coal-cutting technologies in mining methods.
- ▶ Implementation of Safety Management Plans as per Coal Mines Regulations, 2017 including mandatory safety audits.
- Integration of fly ash filling protocols into mining plans.
- **▶** Mandatory preparation of Mine Closure Plans for abandoned or discontinued mines post-2009.

## Significance of Sustainable coal mining

- ➤ Promotes systematic, scientific mining through adoption of new technologies.
- > Promote responsible mining practices that support both coal industry and broader ecosystem.
- Robust safety measures to safeguard interest of workers.

# About Yoga

- Meaning: The word "Yoga" is derived from the Sanskrit root yuj meaning
  - It symbolizes the unity of mind and body, and a holistic approach to health and well-being.
- It is one of the six Schools of Indian Philosophy. Remaining are-Vaishesika, Nyaya, Samkhya, Purva Mimansa and Vedanta or Ŭttara Mimansa.
- Genesis:
  - A number of seals and fossil remains of Indus Valley Civilisation, dating back to 2700 BC indicates that yoga was prevalent in ancient India.
  - The word yoga is referred in all the four Vedas.
  - However, systematic reference of yoga is found in Patanjali's Yogasutra (2nd century B.C.).
    - Other book of Patañjali: Mahabhashya ("Great Commentary")

# **Yoga and Cultural Diplomacy**

- Yoga has emerged as a key instrument of India's soft power and one of India's biggest cultural exports playing a major role in cultural diplomacy.
  - Cultural diplomacy is the "exchange of ideas, information, art, language and other aspects of culture among nations and peoples in order to foster mutual understanding'.

# **Union Education Ministry cancelled UGC-NET 2024**

Exam was cancelled due to reports of cheating and paper leak which compromised the integrity of the exam.

**▶ University Grants Commission-National Eligibility Test (UGC-NET)** is conducted by the **National Testing Agency**.

## Reasons for cheating in examination

- Positive attitude towards cheating: due to which students avoid taking responsibility for their actions.
- Societal pressures: success is measured by marks rather than the ability to complete the learning process with integrity.
- **Delayed justice:** general perception of the judicial system being slow and ineffective.
- Overambition and Pursuit of self-interest: Students may intentionally cheat to gain an unjust advantage over others.

#### Ethical reasonings against cheating in examinations

Violates deontological ethics: Students adopt unfair means (cheating) for favourable ends (results).

# **Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means)**

Act, 2024.

- It was enacted by the government to bring greater transparency, fairness and credibility to the public examination systems.
- > It deals with unfair means by various entities involved in conducting public examinations by the Central Government and its agencies.
- It lists 15 actions that amount to using unfair means in public examinations "for monetary or wrongful gain," like leakage of question papers.
  - All offenses under the Act will be cognizable, non-bailable, and non-compoundable.
- Against Utilitarianism: Cheating does not serve the Society and does not satisfy its interests as people who are not capable of providing the needed knowledge and services are given positions.
- Justice as Fairness Principle: Cheating violates human liberties and equality of opportunities and supports unjust differences.
- Virtue Ethics: Virtues of truth, trust, and excellence of character do not support deception or dishonesty.

## Strategic convergence in relation with Gulf Region

- **Economic:** The Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) is India's largest regional bloc trading partner.
- Energy security: India imported 55.3% of its total crude oil in 2022-23 from the Gulf region.
- Regional geo-economic and connectivity focus: Engagement in various groups like I2U2 (India, Israel, United Arab Emirates, United States), India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC), etc.
- **Defence and security cooperation:** Such as securing maritime lines of communication from pirates.
- **Welfare of Indian diaspora:** More than 8 million Indians (or people of Indian origin) working in and around this region.

#### Challenges

- ▶ Hamas-Israel war and the Red Sea attacks on Indian ships by Yemen's houthis.
- **Growing engagement** of Gulf countries with China.

# India's share in global space economy to rise 4 times by 2030 in comparison to 2021

This was highlighted by Minister of State for Science & Technology.

In 2021, Indian space industry chad a 2% global share in had global space economy. This will rise to 15% by 2047.

#### Indian **Space Economy Status**

- In 2023, size of India's space economy estimated at \$8.4 billion (around 2-3% of global space economy).
- Potential to capture 9% of global market share by 2030.
- Space Start-ups have increased to nearly 200 in 2024 from 1 in 2022.

#### Steps taken in Space Sector

- Indian **Space Policy** 2023 enables end-toend participation of Non-Governmental Entities in all domains of Space activities.
- **National Space Promotion and Authorization** Centre (IN-SPACe), independent nodal agency under Department of Space for allowing space activities.
- New Space India Limited to promote private sector participation.
- Rising involvement of private sector in space missions.
  - fired 3D-printed cryogenic engine capable of running on Cryogenic propellants liquefied natural gas and liquid oxygen.
- Presently, 100% FDI is allowed in the space sector.

#### **Concerns related to Indian Space Economy**

- Constrained space budgets, space spending as a percentage of GDP remains relatively low.
  - United States spends 0.28% of its economy on space.
- **Dearth for trained scientists, engineers, and technicians** to meet the demands of an expanding space program.
- Absence of clear national space legislation, which leads to a lack of clarity on planning and conducting space-related activities.

## **Neglected Tropical Disease (NTD)**

Chad has become the first country in 2024 and 51st globally to eliminate a NTD i.e. gambiense form of Human African trypanosomiasis (sleeping sickness).

It is a vector-borne parasitic disease caused by Trypanosoma parasite.

#### About NTDs

- Diverse group of conditions caused by variety of pathogens (including viruses, bacteria, parasites, fungi and toxins). Examples: Dengue and chikungunya, leprosy, onchocerciasis
- Mainly prevalent among impoverished communities in tropical
- Preventable and treatable when detected early.
- India has eliminated NTDs like guinea worm, trachoma, and
- Initiatives to eliminated NTDs: London Declaration, and Kigali Declaration on NTDs; World NTD Day (30 January); etc.



# **Iberian lynx (Lynx pardinus)**

According to IUCN, conservation status of Iberian lynx has improved from Endangered to Vulnerable, reflecting significant increase in its population.

# **About Iberian lynx**

- Habitat: Medium-sized wild cat species native to Iberian Peninsula in southwestern Europe, (Portugal and Spain).
- Appearance: Weighs about half as much as Eurasian species, with long legs, short tail with a black tip, tufted ears and relatively small head.
- Characteristics: Solitary hunter; nocturnal or crepuscular; may temporarily become diurnal during winter; live in small, isolated meta-populations; European Rabbit accounts for 80-99% of its
- Threats: Decreasing food base, Poaching, habitat loss etc.
- Conservation status: Appendix I of CITES.









#### **Diatom**

A new freshwater diatom genus named Indiconema discovered from **Eastern and Western Ghats.** 

#### **About Diatom**

- They're unicellular algae belonging to a phytoplankton group.
- They're **eukaryotes** and **non-motile**.
- Only organisms with cell walls composed of transparent, opaline silica. Thus, the walls are indestructible.
  - Diatom cell wall deposits accumulate over billions of years forming diatomaceous earth.

#### Significance

- Chief 'producers' in oceans and produced 20-30% of global oxygen.
- **Excellent indicators** of aquatic health.
- Remove carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) from atmosphere, convert CO<sub>2</sub> to organic carbon in form of sugar, and release oxygen.
- Serve as a base of aquatic food chain. E.g. Diatoms-Crustaceans-
- Help in **nutrient cycling** of marine and lake waters.



#### **Asiatic Lion**

Six Asiatic lions have migrated from Gir Forest to the Barda Wildlife Sanctuary (BWS).

#### **About Asiatic lions**

- **Protection status** 
  - IUCN status: Endangered
  - **CITES:** Appendix I
  - Wildlife (Protection) Act 1972: Schedule I and IV
- Characteristics
  - They are slightly smaller than African lions.
  - Males have only moderate mane growth at the top of the
  - Lions have no particular breeding season.
- Habitat: Only in Gir forest and other protected areas in Gujarat's Saurashtra region.

World Investment Report 2024 released by UN Trade and Development (UNCTAD).

## **Key findings**

- Globally, foreign direct investment flows declined by 2% in 2023.
- Sizeable declines were recorded in India.
- Mobilization of funds for SDG investment through sustainable finance products is slowing down.

#### **About UNCTAD**

- It is a permanent intergovernmental body established by the United Nations General Assembly in 1964.
- It supports developing countries to access the benefits of a globalized economy more fairly and effectively.

# About Mata ni pachedi paintings

- The **Vaghari community** is known to paint these pachedis.
- These paintings are used for rituals and are only painted by
- It features the divine feminine at the centre, surrounded by depictions of devotees, flora and fauna.
- It is drawn with kalam (pen) made of bamboo sticks.
- Paintings are traditionally in maroon, black, white.



## **Kolar Gold Fields (KGF)**

#### **About KGF**

- These gold mines are located about 100 kilometres from Bangalore in **Kolar district** of Karnataka.
- These are operated by the Bharat Gold Mines Limited (BGML), a public sector undertaking.

- These mines are among the deepest in the world which makes mining of this ore a very expensive process.

#### Twin Technology

- Virtual representation of a physical object or system.
- It is dynamic model that mimics behaviour of its real-world counterpart in real-time or near-real-time.



#### Methanol

#### **About Methanol**

- It is also known as wood alcohol.
- Appears as a colorless fairly volatile liquid with a faintly sweet pungent odor like that of ethyl alcohol.
- Uses: Solvent in paints, varnishes and chiefly for making formaldehyde.
- Food Safety and Standards (Alcoholic Beverages) Regulations 2018 stipulate the maximum permissible quantity of methanol in different liquors.



# Striped caecilian (Ichthyophis spp)

A striped caecilian has been added to fauna in Kaziranga National Park and Tiger Reserve.

## **About Striped caecilian**

- Caecilians are a separate group of amphibians classified under order Apoda.
- Characteristics
  - Limbless amphibians that spend most of their life burrowed under soil.
  - Wormlike animals, with smooth, moist skin which appears narrowly segmented.
  - Eyes are small and covered with skin, and their visual perception is limited to determining between light and dark.
  - Able to take in oxygen both through their skin and lungs.
  - Genus Ichthyophis are egg-laying.
- Habitat: Six families of Caecilians are recognised ranging through Africa, South America and Southeast Asia.
