United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) Launched Food Waste Index (FWI) Report 2024

- Report co-authored with WRAP (Waste and Resources Action Programme) was published ahead of International Day of Zero Waste (observed annually on 30 March).
- > FWI tracks global and national generation of food and inedible parts wasted at retail and consumer (household and food service) levels.
 - ⊕ It supports the goals of two indicators of SDG 12.3 which is to be achieved by 2030 i.e.
 - SDG 12.3.1 (a), Food Loss Index (FLI), reduce food losses along production and supply chains, including post-harvest losses. Food and Agriculture Organization is custodian of FLI.
 - SDG 12.3.1 (b), FWI, halve per-capita global food waste at retail and consumer levels. UNEP is custodian of FWI.

Key findings

- Households across all continents wasted over 1 billion meals a day in 2022, while 783 million people were affected by hunger and a third of humanity faced food insecurity.
- ⊕ Food Waste generates an estimated 8-10% of global greenhouse gas emissions.
- A Issues
 - Due to lack of robust cold chains, hotter countries generate more food waste per capita in households.
 - Insufficient Data for retail and food service sectors, particularly in low and middle-income countries.
 - Fragmented food system.

About WRAP

It is a climate action NGO (established in UK in 2000) working to tackle causes of climate crisis and give the planet a sustainable future.

Suggestions for reducing food waste through collaborative approach

- Systemic action through Public-Private Partnerships (PPPs) model. Example, Courtauld Commitment 2030 (UK), Australian Food Pact etc.
- Establish a roadmap or delivery plan, targeting priority areas or "hotspots" of waste.

IRENA releases "A World Energy Transitions Outlook Brief: Tracking CoP 28 outcomes" report

- Report tracks global progress towards the energy transition commitment to triple renewables by 2030 as outlined in COP 28 of UNFCCC (held in November 2023).
- Key findings
 - Denchmark yet insufficient progress: 2023 added 473 GW (73% contributed by Solar energy) additional Renewable to global energy mix.
 - However, annual addition must reach almost 1100 GW to meet tripling target.
 - Geographical disparities: With a growth of 20.1%, Asia was leader in renewable deployment and its growth was driven by China.
 - Progress in electrification: Road transport has highest potential for electrification.
 - New EV models, financial incentives and improving charging infrastructure are key drivers for this.
- > Challenges in achieving tripling target:
 - Rising financing costs
 - Supply chain issues (bottlenecks for some technologies and market oversupply in others), etc.
- Recommendations to achieve tripling target
 - Reforming multilateral finance mechanisms
 - Supporting infrastructure (e.g., power grids, storage)

 - International cooperation for
 - Developing renewable supply chain.
 - Enhancing institutional and human capacity.
 - Scaling up and broadening access to low cost finance.



IRENA

HQ: Abu Dhabi (UAE)

- Genesis: Proposal for an international agency dedicated to renewable energy was made in 1981 at the UN Conference on New and Renewable Sources of Energy, held in Nairobi, Kenya.
 - IRENA was founded in Bonn (Germany) in 2009 with 75 states signing the IRENA Statute at the time.
- **▶ About:** It is a leading **global intergovernmental agency** for energy transformation.
- ▶ Functions: Serves as the principal platform for international cooperation, supports countries in their energy transitions, and provides state of the art data and analyses on technology, etc.
- Members: 168 countries and the EU (India is also a member).
- Major reports by IRENA
 - World Energy Transition Outlook
 - ⊕ Renewable Energy Outlook for ASEAN
 - Renewable Energy for Agriculture







Supreme Court (SC) calls for stricter approach in granting bail to police in custodial death cases

- While referring to its Judgment of State of Jharkhand v Sandeep Kumar, SC made an exception and invoked Article 136 to set aside bail granted to Police officer by a High Court in a case of custodial death.
 - Article 136 gives discretionary power to SC to grant special leave to appeal from any judgement or order made by any court or tribunal India.
 - It is not applied to orders passed by any court or tribunal constituted by any law relating to Armed Forces.
- Custodial death is a manifestation of custodial violence which primarily refers to violence (including rape and torture) in police custody and judicial custody.
- Safeguard against Custodial death
 - **⊕** Constitutional
 - ◆ Article 14 (Right to equality before law)
 - Article 21 (Right to life)
 - Legal
 - Sec 330 & 331 of IPC provides punishment for injury inflicted for extorting confession during custody
 - Section 176 Cr.P.C, calls for magisterial enquiry in case of custodial death.
 - Other
 - ◆ International Covenant On Civil And Political Rights (India is Signatory)
 - D.K Basu v. State of West Bengal, SC gave specific guidelines for safeguarding of detainees.
 - NHRC guideline calls for reporting of custodial death or rape within 24 hrs of occurrence

External Affairs Minister (EAM) of India visited Malaysia

- EAM visit was aimed at strengthening bilateral cooperation in areas like trade, defence, culture and education etc. and enhancing strategic partnership between two countries.
- India- Malaysia Bilateral Relations
 - India established diplomatic relations with Malaysia in 1957.
 - O Strategic: Malaysia is part of India's Act East policy and also a key partner for India in ASEAN (Association of South-East Asian Nations).
 - Defence Cooperation: Conducted Joint Exercise "Harimau Shakti" (Army) annually, Samudra Lakshman Maritime Exercise (Navy), Udara Shakti (Air force) and Royal Malaysian

Navy Ship participates in Exercise MILAN.

- Trade: Both sides signed Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement, a free trade agreement.
 - Bilateral trade touched \$19.4
 billion during 2021-22.
 - Trade between both countries can be settled in Indian Rupee in addition to current modes of settlement in other currencies.
 - India imports palm oil mainly from Indonesia and Malaysia.
- Cultural: Indian Cultural Centre, Kuala Lumpur conducts classes in Carnatic Vocal, Kathak dance, Yoga, Hindi language by trained teachers from India and Malaysia.
 - Centre was renamed as Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Indian Cultural Center (NSCBICC) in 2015.
- Humanitarian Assistance: More than 1 lakh Indians nationals repatriated from Malaysia under Vande Bharat Mission during Covid-19.





Non-ratification of UN Convention against torture, 1997

Absence of a National level anti-torture framework

Lengthy judicial proceedings

UNESCO endorsed the addition of 18 new Geoparks to the Global Geoparks Network (GGN)

- ▶ Latest addition raises the number of total Geoparks to 213 which are spread across 48 countries (no geopark in India).
- > Some major geoparks added to GGN are:
 - Land of Extinct Volcanoes (Poland): Features distinctive remnants of Paleozoic and Cenozoic volcanoes.
 - Impact Crater Lake (Finland): Europe's largest impact crater lake formed through a collision with a meteorite 78 million years ago.
 - Uberaba (Brazil): Its tag line 'Land of the Giants' refers to its rich palaeontological heritage.
- UNESCO's Global Geopark (UGGPs)
 - Genesis: Geopark concept arose in the mid-1990's and UGGP was created in 2015
 - About: UGGPs are single, unified geographical areas where landscapes of international geological significance are managed with a holistic concept of
 - Protection,
 - Education and
 - Sustainable development.
 - Management: Managed by a body having a legal existence recognized under national legislation.
 - Designation is not permanent: Designation is for four years after which it is reassessed.
 - Mandatory Networking: Membership of the Global Geoparks Network (GGN) is obligatory for UGGPs.
 - Significance
 - UGGPs give local people a sense of pride in their region and strengthen their identification with the area.
 - New sources of revenue are generated through geotourism.

Global Geoparks Network (GGN)

- It is a non-profit International Association officially established in 2014.
 - GGN was founded as an international partnership developed under the umbrella of UNESCO.
- Networking and collaboration among Global Geoparks is an important component of the GGN.

International Finance Corporation (IFC) released Green and Social Bond Impact Report 2023

▶ IFC launched Green Bond Program in 2010 to unlock investment for private sector eligible projects that seek to mitigate climate change and Social Bond Program in 2017.

Key Highlights

- \$2 billion raised through Green bond is expected to reduce
 3.3 million metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent per year.
- \$1.2 billion raised through Social bonds will cater sectors like Agribusiness, Gender finance, Education, etc.

About Green Bonds

- Debt securities designated to finance environment-friendly projects like Sustainable Water and Waste Management, Green Buildings, Pollution control etc.
- In 2022, Ministry of Finance approved India's First Sovereign Green Bonds (SGBs) Framework which excludes projects like nuclear power generation, landfill projects, hydropower plants larger than 25 Megawatt etc.
- In 2023, India issued first tranche of its first SGBs worth Rs. 80 billion.

About Social bonds

- Financial instrument issued by governments; corporations to raise funds for projects to address social issues like affordable housing, healthcare etc. to benefit vulnerable populations.
- In 2023, National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) raises more than Rs. 1000 crore via social bonds.

International Finance Corporation

- HQ: Washington, DC (USA)
- Established in 1956, it is a member of World Bank Group and largest global development institution focused on private sector in developing countries.

Initiatives for Prevention of Crimes against Peacekeepers

- India-led Group of Friends (GOF) launched a new database designed to record crimes against Peacekeepers & monitor progress in holding perpetrators accountable.
 - The GOF was launched by India in 2022 to promote accountability for crimes against the Blue Helmets during its presidency of the UN Security Council
- UN peacekeeping forces are employed to maintain or re-establish peace in an area of armed conflict. However, they sometimes face violence in deployed regions.
 - These forces are also referred to as Blue Helmets as they are equipped in blue-coloured helmets.
 - They won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1988.



Index of Eight Core Industries (ICI)

- Combined ICI increased by 6.7% (provisional) in February 2024 as compared to the Index of February 2023.
- The ICI measures the combined and individual performance of production of eight core industries
 - Eight core industries are Fertilizers, Cement, Natural Gas, Crude Oil, Coal, Electricity, Steel, and Petroleum Refinery Products.
 - They comprise 40.27% of the weight of items included in the Index of Industrial Production (IIP).
 - ICI is released by the Office of the Economic Adviser, Ministry of Commerce & Industry.









White Rabbit (WR) Technology

- CERN has launched the White Rabbit Collaboration (WRC) to foster the uptake of White Rabbit technology by Industry.
 - The Collaboration aims to provide dedicated support and training, facilitate R&D projects in the technology.

WR technology

- ⊕ It was developed at CERN to provide sub-nanosecond accuracy and picosecond precision of synchronisation for the Large Hadron Collider (LHC) accelerator chain.
 - LHC is the world's largest and most powerful particle
 - It was first used in 2012 and in 2020, it was included in the worldwide industry standard known as Precision Time Protocol (PTP).



Coronavirus Network (CoViNet)

- World Health Organisation (WHO) has launched a new CoViNet.
- **About CoViNet**
 - It is a network of **global laboratories** with expertise in human, animal and environmental coronavirus surveillance.
 - It currently includes 36 laboratories from 21 countries (3 in India) in all 6 WHO regions.
 - It aims to facilitate and coordinate global expertise for early and accurate detection, monitoring and assessment of SARS-CoV-2, MERS-CoV and novel coronaviruses of public health importance.



Kalam-250

- Skyroot Aerospace has successfully test-fired Stage-2 of Vikram-1 space launch vehicle, called Kalam-250.
 - dense atmosphere of Earth to deep vacuum of outer space.
 - Vikram-1 is three-stage, solid-fuel based rocket.
- **About Kalam-250**
 - ⊕ It is a high-strength carbon composite rocket motor, which uses solid fuel and high-performance Ethylene-Propylene-Diene terpolymers (EPDM) Thermal **Protection System.**
 - Solid propellant in Kalam-250 was processed by Solar **Industries** at Nagpur facility.
 - Earlier, Skyroot had tested Kalam-100, third stage of Vikram-1, which was test-fired successfully in 2021.

IRRI

International Rice Research Institute (IRRI) -South Asia Regional Centre (ISARC)

- ISARC will develop rice varieties with low methane emissions and enhance productivity of premium quality nutritious rice.
 - ⊕ To achieve this, ISARC is promoting adoption of best agronomic and management practices like Dry Seeded Rice and Alternate Wet and Drying.
- About ISARC
 - Established in 2018 through MoU between India's Department of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare and IRRI.
 - Located at Varanasi, Utter Pradesh.
 - O Dedicated to strengthening rice-based agri-food system in South Asia region by developing climate-resilient, bio-fortified rice varieties for farmers and consumers.
- About IRRI (HQ: Los Banos, Philippines)
 - Dedicated to reducing poverty and hunger through rice science; etc.



Gyps Indicus (Indian Vulture)

- Moyar valley located in Mudumalai Tiger Reserve is the only region with largest nesting colony of Gyps vultures in wild.
- **About Gyps Indicus**
 - **⊕** Characteristics
 - Possess whitish feathers on a dark head and neck, and a pale collar.
 - Colonial nesters and often seen in flocks.
 - Population is declining.
 - - Habitat Specialization: Open Grassland.
 - Found in Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan.
 - Protection Status
 - IUCN: Critically Endangered
 - Wildlife Protection Act-1972: Schedule I
 - **⊕** Conservation Measures
 - Banning of Non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs like diclofenac, Ketoprofen for veterinary use.
 - Vulture Action Plan 2020-25.



Tiger Triumph 2024

- Harbour Phase of the exercise Tiger Triumph is being conducted at Visakhapatnam (Andhra Pradesh).
- Tiger Triumph is a Bilateral Tri-Service Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) Amphibious Exercise between India and the US.
