

# Gravitational waves (GW) reveal 1st-of-its-kind merger between neutron star and mystery object

- Merger is officially known as GW230529, detected by the LIGO-Virgo-Kagra collaboration in 2023. The GW came from a merger of two objects:
  - Neutron Star (formed when a massive star runs out of fuel and collapses)
  - Mystery object whose mass lies in the 'mass gap'.
    - Mass gap is the range of mass between the heaviest known neutron star and the lightest known black hole.
- GWs are 'ripples' in space-time caused by some of the most violent and energetic processes in the Universe that propagate in all directions away from the source. Predicted in Einstein's General Theory of Relativity (1916).
  - **⊙** Its key Features includes:
    - Travel at the speed of light.
    - Produced by: Cataclysmic events such as colliding black holes, stars exploding at the end of their lifetimes, colliding neutron stars, etc.
    - GWs' first detection: In 2015 and detected at the Laser Interferometer Gravitational-Wave Observatory (LIGO).
- ➤ GWs' significance: It carries information about their origins; clues to the nature of gravity itself; information about the universe that cannot be observed with electromagnetic waves etc.

#### **About LIGO**

- Consists of two interferometers, each with two 4 km long arms arranged in the shape of an "L". These instruments act as 'antennae' to detect GWs.
- Comprises stable high-power lasers, precisely figured mirrors, ultraquiet vibration isolation systems, and sophisticated hierarchical feedback systems.
- ▶ LIGO-India: It will be built by the Department of Atomic Energy (DAE) and the Department of Science and Technology (DST), in Maharashtra.

# Supreme Court expresses concern over misuse of content on social media platforms

- SC denounced spread of factually incorrect and unfounded statements made regarding pending cases on social media platforms.
- Reasons for Misuse of social media
  - Internet growth coupled with anonymity.
  - Rise in user base.
  - Ambiguity in law, like, on responsibility of social media platforms.
  - Others: Rise of artificial intelligence (AI) for e.g., deepfake; absence of robust grievance redressal mechanism, etc.
- Negatives Impacts of Misuse
  - Prejudiced Narratives: based on incomplete or inaccurate information.
  - Excessive Trolling, unjustified public opinions.
  - Defamation and Invasion of Privacy: Morphed images of women, revenge porn, disrespect to religious sentiments, etc.
  - Fear of bias in Judicial Decisions: pressure to align with public sentiment.
  - Others: spread of disharmony, financial frauds, incitement of violence, etc.
- Steps taken by government to curb misuse
  - Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules 2021.
  - → PIB's Fact Check Unit under IT Rules 2021.
  - Govt advisory mandating intermediaries to communicate prohibited content
  - Blocking OTT platforms publishing obscene, vulgar content etc.
- Way ahead

  - Ollaboration between governments, tech companies, and civil society organizations etc.







# Indian expatriate could become the first Indian space tourist

- Blue Origin's (American Space startup) NS-25 mission will take six passengers to space tourism.
  - Space tourism refers to traveling into space for recreational purposes.
- Types of Space tourism:
  - Osuborbital space flights (altitude of 100 km referred as Karman Line),
  - Orbital Space Flights (altitudes over 400 kilometers) and
  - Lunar space tourism (full trips to moon).
- According to estimates, global space tourism market size is expected to grow at compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 44.8% from 2024 to 2030.
- Factors Responsible for Growth:
  - Advancements in Technology: Reusable rockets, improved spacecraft.
  - Public Interest and Awareness: Media coverage, documentaries.
  - Diverse Offerings: space hotels, leisure time in space.
  - Reduced Costs, economies of scale.
  - Innovative Business Models: Partnerships, crowdfunding.
  - Government Support: Incentives, regulatory frameworks.
- Concerns: Space debris pollutes Earth's atmosphere, ethical consideration- affordable by rich only, regulatory issues such as who's liable in case of accident, health issues due to microgravity effects, radiation exposure etc.
- Existing Legal Framework: Outer Space Treaty (1967), Convention on International Liability for Damage Caused by Space Objects etc.
- Way Forward: Promoting inclusive and green space tourism, developing comprehensive regulatory framework etc.

# Indian Institute of Science (IISc) designed novel hydrogel to remove Microplastics from water

- Hydrogel has a unique intertwined polymer network that can bind the microplastic and degrade them using Ultraviolet (UV) light irradiation.
  - It consists of three different polymer layers chitosan, polyvinyl alcohol and polyaniline.
  - These polymers are combined with the nanoclusters [copper substitute polyoxometalate (Cu-POM)].
    - Nanoclusters act as a catalyst that can use UV light for degradation.
  - It showed high efficiency during research.
- About Microplastics
  - Small plastic fragments typically less than 5 millimeters long.
  - Categories of microplastics:
    - Primary: Tiny particles designed for commercial use (for e.g., microbeads in cosmetics, toothpaste etc.), microfibers shed from clothing and other textiles, such as fishing nets.
    - Secondary: These are particles that result from the breakdown of larger plastic items, such as water bottles. This breakdown is caused by exposure to environmental factors, mainly the sun's radiation and ocean waves.
- - Environment: Can be mistakenly consumed by marine organisms (toxic for them) and will disturb whole food chain.
    - It has reached to the remote areas like Antarctica.
  - Human Health: Gastrointestinal issues, Endocrine disruption, Respiratory problems, allergy etc.

#### **Initiative Taken**

- Global
  - Global Partnership on Plastic Pollution and Marine Litter (GPML), launched at the United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development (Rio+20) Summit, 2012
  - International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (MARPOL), adopted by International Maritime Organization in 1973
- India
  - Single-use plastics ban with effect from 2022.
  - Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) for plastic under Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016
  - Un-Plastic Collective, co-founded by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), UNEP and WWF-India







# **Volcanic Vortex Rings (VVR)** observed from the Mount Etna

- VVR, also known as volcanic smoke rings, are generated when gas, predominantly water vapor, is released rapidly through a circular vent in the volcanic crater.
- Mt Etna is the world's most active volcano, located on the east coast of Sicily (Italy).
  - Also, it is the largest volcano of Europe.
  - It lies in the highly active tectonic zone of Mediterranean Sea region which is part of the Mid-continental Volcanic Belt.
    - The other important belt includes Circum pacific (ring of fire) and Mid-Atlantic belt.
- Why Mediterranean Sea region has highly active tectonic zone?
  - Located on the convergent boundary between the Eurasian and African continental plates, and other minor plates.
  - Convergence of plates creates subduction zone in western part of sea, leading to formation of volcanoes.
    - ◆ A subduction zone is a collision between two of Earth's tectonic plates, where one plate sinks into the mantle underneath the other plate.
  - Ochains of submarine volcanoes have been created in the sea.
  - The important volcanoes in the region are Mt Vesuvius, Stromboli, etc.

# **Election Commission of India for the first time provides** facilities of home voting in coming 2024 election

- The step is in line with Election Commission (EC) motto 'No voter is left behind'.
- Home Voting Facility:
  - Under this, voting from home takes place with involvement of a full contingent of polling staff and security personnel with secrecy of voting diligently maintained.
  - Beneficiaries:
    - Persons with disabilities (PwDs) meeting 40% benchmark disability.
    - Senior citizens aged above 85 years.
- Other Steps by EC to make voting inclusive:
  - Ease of voting by abolishing Form-M for kashmiri migrants residing at Jammu and Udhampur.
  - SVEEP (Systematic Voter's Education and Electoral Participation) to engage PwDs and also sensitise their friends, families, polling officials,
  - Proposed Multi-Constituency Remote Electronic Voting Machine (RVM): It would enable migrant voters to exercise their vote from their current place of residence.
  - Postal ballot: It allows votes being sent by post. following Persons are entitled to vote by post:
    - special voters.
    - service voters.
    - voters on election duty and.
    - electors subjected to preventive detention
  - Proxy voting: It allows registered elector to delegate his voting rights to a representative he nominates. Available for service voters.

#### Service voters include:

- Member of armed forces;
- Member of police force of a State, who is serving outside that State;
- Person who is employed under Government of India, in a post outside India.
- Member of a force to which Army Act, 1950 is applicable.

# **Kuchipudi Dance**

- Reports highlighted that artists of Kuchipudi dance struggling for survival.
- **About Kuchipudi** 
  - Olassical Indian dance form, originated in the Kuchipudi village of Andhra Pradesh.
  - Kev Features:
    - Known for its quick moves, lively eye expressions, etc.
    - Trangam (dance move performed on the edge of a brass plate with the help of feet).
    - Has 2 forms- traditional musical dance-drama and the solo dance.
  - Siddhendra Yogi, a Vaishnava poet and visionary, conceived the Kuchipudi style of Yakshagaana (folk dance of Karnataka) in the 17th century.

- About ADB
  - Established: 1966
  - Headquarters: Manila, Philippines

  - largest shareholders: Japan and United States.
  - Other prominent reports published: Asia-Pacific Trade Facilitation Report 2024: Asia Bond Monitor etc.









### **Doxxing**

- Incidents of Doxxing are increasing over internet.
- **About Doxxing** 
  - The term "doxxing" is derived from phrase "dropping dox (documents).
  - It refers to collection of a user's private information, across multiple platforms (including social media) by an unauthorized individual and
    - then publishing the information in an attempt to shame or embarrass user.
  - Conducted by researching public databases, hacking, or through social engineering.
  - Prevention: Adjust social media settings, use strong passwords, report through National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal, etc.



## Plankton, Aerosol, Climate, ocean Ecosystem (PACE) Satellite

- NASA's PACE data on ocean, atmosphere, and climate is now available to the public.
- **About PACE:** 
  - Placed in a Sun-synchronous orbit, which means that it will always be synced to the same position relative to the Sun.
  - Sensors: OCI (Ocean Colour Instrument), HARP-2 (Hyper-Angular Rainbow Polarimeter-2) and SPEXone (Spectro-Polarimeter for Planetary Exploration).
  - Key Objectives
    - Understanding how the ocean and atmosphere exchange carbon dioxide.
    - Revealing how aerosols might fuel phytoplankton growth in the surface ocean.



## **Sudan Conflict**

- A year-long conflict in Sudan unleashed waves of ethnic violence and driven millions into extreme hunger and creating large displacement crisis.
- Other conflict areas in Africa:
  - Libya: Forces fight to capture rich oil fields.
  - Ethiopia: Tigray war.
  - Somalia: Conflict with Al- Shabaab.
  - Democratic Republic of Congo: Rebel group called March 23 Movement (M23).



### **Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission (IPC)**

- Recently, Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission (IPC) has issued a drug safety alert over the use of the anti-inflammatory drug Nimesulide.
- - Autonomous Institution of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.
  - Basic function is to update regularly the standards of drugs.
  - It publishes Indian Pharmacopoeia (IP).
    - IP prescribes standards for identity, purity and strength of drugs essentially required from health care perspective of human beings and animals.
  - O It further promotes rational use of generic medicines by publishing National Formulary of India.



### Renewable Energy Technology Action (RETAP)

- First virtual Joint working group meeting of RETAP was held between representatives of India and USA.
- **About RETAP** 
  - RETAP was announced by India and US jointly in 2023 under Strategic Clean Energy Partnership (SCEP).
    - SCEP, launched in 2021, is collaborative effort between India-US to accelerate clean energy innovation and deployment.
  - RETAP's initial focus is to be on green/clean hydrogen, wind energy, ocean/tidal energy etc.
  - Work is guided by five themes: Research & Development, Piloting & Testing of Innovative Technologies etc.



## Whooping cough

- Number of cases of whooping cough have been rising in China.
- **About Whooping Cough** 
  - It is highly contagious respiratory tract infection.
  - Ocaused by: Bordetella pertussis bacteria. The bacteria attaches to cilia (tiny, hair-like extensions), part of upper respiratory system.
  - It is only found in humans.
  - Spread easily from person to person through the air.
  - Symptoms: Runny nose, Nasal congestion Red watery eyes, Fever
  - In India, Mission Indradhanush provides immunization protection against Whooping Cough.

#### Mali (Capital: Bamako)

- Mali has banned the media from reporting on activities of political parties and associations.
- **Political Boundaries** 
  - Landlocked country of western Africa.
  - Mainly lies in Sahel region.
    - Sahel is a transitional zone between the arid Sahara (desert) to the north and the belt of humid savannas to the south.
  - Bounded by Algeria (north), Niger and Burkina Faso (east), Côte d'Ivoire and Guinea (south), and Senegal and Mauritania (west).
