ICAR Celebrating Golden Jubilee of Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs)

- India's first pilot KVK was established in the year 1974 by the Indian Council of Agriculture Research (ICAR).
 - \odot At present, India has a network of 731 KVKs where each KVKs serve more than 5000 farmers.
- About KVKs
 - Objective: Reduce the time lag between generation of technology at the research institution and its application to the location specific farmer fields.
 - Established on the recommendation of the Education Commission (1964-66) and a committee headed by Dr. Mohan Singh Mehta (1973).
 - KVKs are part of National Agricultural Research and Extension System (NARS).
 - NARS is responsible for **Agricultural Research Activities** for the benefit of the Indian farming community for producing various crops.
 - Key Activities: On-farm testing to identify the location specificity of agricultural technologies under various farming systems, providing training to farmers etc.
 - - Helped in implementing in-situ Crop Residue Management programme, led to reduction of residue burning in Punjab, etc.
 - District Agricultural Meteorological Units (DAMU) under KVKs are providing Agro-met Advisory Services.
 - KVKs are linked with Common Service Centres (CSCs) programmes, promoting access of government services to farmer.
 - Other: Value addition in agricultural produce, diversification in agriculture through mushroom cultivation, bee keeping, etc.
- **About Indian Council of Agriculture Research**
- ICAR is an autonomous organization registered society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860.
- Apex body for coordinating, guiding and managing research and education in agriculture including horticulture, fisheries and animal sciences.
- Ministry: Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare

NABARD is set to launch ₹1000-crore blended fund for Agritech-startups

- > Fund will bolster technology-driven agri-startups and rural enterprises.
 - Also, it will invest in startups facing challenges in scaling up operations due to limited access to equity and debt instruments to create new forward and backward linkages in the rural ecosystem.
- Agritech startups are individuals or segments of companies using technology in field of agriculture leading to increase in productivity, efficiency, and output.
- Services Provided by Agritech-startups:
 - Promotes Smart Agriculture: It is done by providing Information on crop yields, rainfall patterns, pest infestation, and soil nutrition.
 - Farming as a service: For instance, EM3 Agri Services offers farming services and machinery rentals to farmers on a pay-for-use basis.
 - ● Big data analytics: Development of farm-specific, data-driven diagnostics to determine soil and crop health can boost productivity and farmer income.
 - It involves use of Artificial Intelligence, etc.
- Challenges faced by them: Incubators' competence (incubators are in early stage of learning curve),
 Business model (Unable to connect to real problems of large number of stakeholder), lack of seed fund, Lack of mentorship etc.

Key Initiatives Taken

- Digital Agriculture Mission (DAM), 2021, includes India Digital Ecosystem of Agriculture (IDEA), Farmers Database, Funding to the States on the new Technology (NeGPA) etc.
- Innovation and Agri-Entrepreneurship Development Programme, under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) from 2018-19 to promote innovation and agri-entrepreneurship.
- Agri startups can avail loan under Priority Sector lending facility by Banks as per direction of RBI.
- NIDHI Seed Support Program (NIDHI-SSP), under Department of Science & Technology (DST).

Patents (Amendment) Rules, 2024 notified by the Department For Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT)

- > Rules have been brought in accordance with the **Patents Act 1970** to amend **Patents Rules, 2003**.
- Rules aim at simplifying the process of obtaining and managing patents thereby fulfilling the Viksit Bharat Sankalp.
- Key Provisions:-
 - Introduced New 'Certificate of Inventorship' to acknowledge the contribution of inventors in the patented invention.
 - Time limit for filing request for examination has been reduced from 48 months to 31 months.
 - Renewal fee has been reduced by 10% if paid in advance through electronic mode for a period of at least 4 years.
 - Frequency to file the statements of working of patents has been reduced from once in a financial year to once in every three financial years.
- Rules will support the other initiatives for promoting Patents, such as
 - National Intellectual property rights (IPR) Policy 2016, it includes
 - National Intellectual Property Awareness Mission (NIPAM)
 - Patent Facilitation Programme
 - Expand Knowledge Capacity & Skill Building through initiative like Scheme for Pedagogy & Research in IPRs for Holistic Education and Academia (SPRIHA).

About Patent

- > A statutory right granted by the respective governments.
- It gives the exclusive rights and bars others from making, using, selling and importing product or process, based on the patented invention without prior permission.
- Time period: 20 years
- Criteria for patent:- Should be novel, must involve an inventive step, capable of industrial production etc.
- India has ratified Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT).
- Indian patent office has granted >1 lakh patents between Mar, 2023 to Mar, 2024.

UN Secretary-General urges for disarmament in Security Council meeting held in Japan

- Calling for disarmament now, he urged States with nuclear arsenals to lead the way across six areas for action.
- Dialogue to work together for transparency and prevent accidental use.
- Threats to use nuclear weapons should stop.
- Nuclear weapon States must re-affirm moratoria on nuclear testing.
- Nuclear weapon states must fulfil their disarmament commitments.
- A joint no first-use agreement.
- US and Russia should resume talks to reduce nuclear stockpiles under New START treaty.
 - New START Treaty is nuclear arms reduction agreement between US and Russia signed in 2010.

Global treaties for Nuclear Disarmament

Treaty	Objective
Partial Test Ban Treaty (PTBT) -1963	Prohibits testing nuclear weapons
Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of nuclear weapons (NPT)- 1967	prevent the spread of nuclear weapons and technology.
Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty (CTBT)-1996	Prohibits all nuclear test explosions (not yet in force).
Treaty on the Prohibition of nuclear weapons (TPNW)- 2017	Prohibits development, testing, possession, and use of nuclear weapons (entered into force in 2021).

India signed and ratified only Partial Test Ban Treaty among above.



New ILO policy brief calls for domestic workers to be included in care policies

- Care policies are public policies that allocate resources to the provision of care and access to care rights, like early childhood care, and long-term care services etc.
- Domestic worker is any person engaged in domestic work within an employment relationship and on an occupational basis.
 - There are 4.75 million domestic workers in India (of which 3 million are women).
- Issues faced by Domestic workers:
 - Lack of Labor rights and social protection as 8 out of every 10 are informally employed.
 - Domestic work is among five sectors accounting for majority of adult **forced labour**.
 - **Other Issues:** Poorly paid jobs, discrimination, sexual exploitation, etc.
- Recommendation made:
 - ● Recognize domestic workers as care workers and include them within national care policies and social security systems.
 - Ratifying International Labour Organization (ILO) Convention 189 called Domestic Workers Convention, 2011, for protecting rights of domestic workers. (India has not ratified).
 - Skills recognition and skills training initiatives that ensure formal valuation of their work.
 - Raise awareness about critical role of domestic workers.

• Steps by India:

- Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace Act, 2013: Protects female domestic workers from sexual exploitation.
- Code on Wages, 2019: has provision for workers engaged as domestic workers.
- Ocde on Social Security, 2020: Provides for social security to all unorganized workers including domestic workers.

Papikonda National Park

In a bird survey held by IISER-Tirupati in Papikonda National Park (Andhra Pradesh), more than 200 bird species have been sighted.

About Papikonda National Park (PNP)

- Located in northern Eastern Ghats, is spread over the Papi Hills and straddles the Godavari river.
- It is an Important Bird and Biodiversity Area.
- ● A unique dwarf breed of goat known locally as the "kanchu mekha" originates in this region.
- Forest type: Dry Mixed Teak Forests, dry mixed deciduous forests, and moist mixed deciduous forests
- Fauna: Gaur, Tiger, Leopard, Hyena, sambar, barking deer, Black-bellied Tern etc.

Supreme Court (SC) refuses to stay H.P. Assembly Speaker order disqualifying MLAs

- The MLAs were disqualified under anti-defection law for defying party's whip to be present in the House and vote in favour of government.
- Anti-defection law deals with defection of members in Parliament or state legislatures.
- > Under it, a member could be disqualified if he/she:
 - Voluntarily gives up the membership of political party or joins any other political party,
 - Votes or abstains from any voting contrary to directive circulated by political party.
 - However, if member has taken prior permission, or is condoned by Party within 15 days from such voting or abstention, he shall not be disqualified.
 - Independent candidate joins a political party after election.
 - A nominated member if he joins any political party after six months from date of taking seat.
- Exemption: If, not less than two-thirds of members of legislature party have agreed to merge with other party they are exempted from disqualification.
- Role of speaker: Chairman or Speaker of House have power in deciding cases pertaining to disqualification of members on ground of defection.
- Issues: Mergers leading to mass defection, Wide power to the Speaker, curtails individual MP/MLAs freedom.

SC Judgements

- Kihoto Hollohon v. Zachilhu and ors (1992): Speaker, while deciding cases pertaining to defection, acts as a tribunal and his decisions are subject to the judicial review power of the high court and SC.
- Ravi S Naik vs Union of India (1994): Voluntarily giving up membership does not necessarily mean that legislator needs to formally resign, as this can be inferred from member's conduct as well.

Air Quality Report 2023

- > Air Quality Report 2023 is released by Swiss organisation IQAir.
- Key Findings:
 - India had the third worst air quality after Bangladesh and Pakistan.
 - New Delhi has been ranked as the World's most Polluted Capital City.
 - ● Bihar's Begusarai has emerged as the world's most polluted metropolitan area.
 - ⊕ More than 1 billion people in India experience PM2.5 concentrations exceeding the WHO's recommended levels of 5 μg/m³.
 - **Only Seven countries** met the WHO annual PM 2.5 guideline.

 - Monitor health of astronauts and provides information of blood pressure, heart rate etc.
 - Seamless communication link by keeping crew connected with onboard computer and ground-based stations.

- Usage

 - ⊖ Makes patients feel detached from their pain and environment.
- Side effects: overdose can cause unconsciousness and dangerously slowed breathing.
- Ketamine has been included as psychotropic substance under Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985.

Tobacco Board

- Tobacco Board authorizes 100 million kg crop size for Karnataka during 2024-25.
- About Tobacco Board (HQ: Guntur, Andhra Pradesh)
 - ● It is statutory body constituted in 1976 under Tobacco Board Act, 1975.

- Function: Export promotion of all varieties of tobacco and its allied products, and production, distribution, and regulation of Flue Cured Virginia tobacco.
- Ministry: Dept. Of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce & Industry.
- In 2021, India stood as 2nd largest country in production and 4th largest exporter of unmanufactured tobacco in world.



Third-Party Application Provider (TPAP)

- Paytm has recently received third-party application provider license from National Payments Corporation of India.
- About TPAP:

 - TPAP participates in UPI through a Payment Service Provider (PSP) bank.
 - PSP is a banking platform. It connects to UPI platform to offer UPI payment services to itself and TPAPs.
 - ✤ Unified Payments Interface (UPI) is a real-time payment system developed by NPCI.



Report by a team of European scientists **identified more than 16000 chemicals in plastics** – from food packaging to toys to medical devices.

- Previously United Nations Environment Programme had identified around 13,000 plastic chemicals.
- Among these chemicals, more than a quarter are thought to be hazardous to human health and environment.
- Important Plastic Chemicals: Diethylhexyl phthalate, Bisphenol A(BPA), Hexabromocyclododecane (HBCD), Dechlorane Plus, etc.

- He was an ardent Gandhian, eminent social reformer & activist.
- Key Contributions:

 - $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{O}}$ He undertook three fasts, during 1946 to 1948, in support of Dalits to enter temples.
 - ● He died after 58 days of fasting in support of creating a separate Andhra from Madras Presidency. He is revered as 'Amarajeevi' for his supreme sacrifice for the cause of people of Andhra.
- Ethical Values: Leadership, courage etc.
