
Bitcoin (Cryptocurrency) Trading in India is similar to a sophisticated version of the Hawala system: Supreme Court (SC)

Remarks were made on a bail application where SC noted the **absence of a clear regime** on **regulating virtual currency**. **About Cryptocurrency and Hawala**

- Cryptocurrency: Form of digital currency (based on the blockchain technology) that utilizes a unique software code. E.g., Bitcoin, Ethereum, etc.
 - Blockchain is an open-source database (public ledger) distributed across a decentralized computer network/internet that forms a permanent record of transactions between parties.
 - Key Features: Non fiat (functions independently of government/Central Bank); No intrinsic Value, etc.
- Hawala: Informal channel for transferring funds from one location to another through service providers (hawaladars) regardless of the transaction nature.
 - Key Features: Based on trust between parties, it does not involve cash movements as hawaladars settle debts among themselves.
- Nexus between Hawala and Cryptocurrency: In Blockchain, nodes can be seen as hawaladar that maintain the network through mutual trust/consensus.

Reasons for Rising Nexus between them

- Outside the Traditional Banking System: Both are unregulated and unreported transaction vulnerable to illicit activities.
- Cheaper: Both are not subjected to prohibitive commissions and currency exchange fees.
- Lack of Transparency: In Cryptocurrencies, transactions are recorded in public ledger anonymously, while in hawala it is done in cash without any paper trail.
- Unique passcodes/Encryption key: While Cryptocurrency uses an encryption key, hawaladars use the passcodes shared between them.



Centre Notifies Cashless Treatment of Road Accident Victims Scheme, 2025

The scheme was launched by Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) based on the powers given by the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988.

Key Provisions of the Scheme

- > Eligibility: Any person being a victim of road accident arising out of use of motor vehicle occurring on any road.
- Coverage: Victims are eligible for cashless treatment up to Rs 1.5 Lakhs at designated hospitals for a maximum period of 7 days from the date of the accident.
- > Nodal Agency: The State Road Safety Council.
- Designated hospitals: States must onboard all capable hospitals, (including those empanelled under the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana), for trauma and poly-trauma care.
 Other Measures taken by India to Improve Road Safety
- Payments to Hospitals: Hospitals can raise claims which are verified by the State Health Agency with payment made from Motor Vehicle Accident Fund within 10 days.
- **Scheme Monitoring Mechanism:** Overseen by a committee, chaired by the Secretary of the MoRTH.

Importance of Implementing Road Safety Measures in India

- Road Accident Status: In 2022, a total of ~4.6 lakh road accidents were reported resulting in ~1.68 lakh deaths.
 India faces highest road accidents globally.
- Fulfilling International commitment: United Nations Decade of Action for Road Safety's goal to halve traffic deaths by 2030.

- Strict Enforcement: The Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Act, 2019 ensures strict penalties for traffic violations and uses technology for enforcement.
- Road Safety Audits: Mandatory audits for all National Highways projects at design, construction, and maintenance stages.
- Electronic Detailed Accident Report (e-DAR) Project: To establish a central repository of road accidents data.
- Scheme for grant of Award to the Good Samaritan: Who save lives of victims by providing immediate assistance and rushing them to a hospital within the Golden Hour (first 60 minutes after a traumatic injury).

United Nations Development Programme Releases Human Development Report, 2025

The Report titled, 'A Matter of Choice: People and Possibilities in the Age of AI' highlights the critical role of AI in shaping the next chapter of human development.

Key Findings of the Report

- India's Human Development Index (HDI) Rank: India moved up 3 spots to rank 130 out of 193 countries in the 2025 Human Development Report.

 - HDI: A composite index measuring average achievement in three basic dimensions of human development—a long and healthy life, knowledge and a decent standard of living.
- > Life Expectancy: India's life expectancy reached 72 years in 2023, marking the highest since the index began.
- Schooling: The average mean years of schooling in India is 13 years (up from 8.2 years in 1990).

Challenges Despite Progress

- National Income: India's GNI per capita rank is seven positions below its HDI rank.
- ● Inequality: Gender disparities remain significant. E.g., India ranks 102nd on the Gender Inequality Index (GII) reflecting challenges in reproductive health, political representation, and workforce participation.

Global Trends in Human Development

- **Globally**, the human development progress had slowed to its weakest pace since 1990.
- The inequality between low and very high HDI countries has increased for the fourth consecutive year.

2025 Human Development Report's AI Related Observations

- India's AI Landscape: Key Findings
 - ● Al Skills Penetration: India has the highest self-reported Al skills penetration globally.
 - ● Global AI Index: In the Global AI Index, India ranks 4th among 36 evaluated countries, making it the only lower-middle-income country in the top 10.
 - Talent Retention: 20% of AI researchers in India now stay domestically, a significant increase from nearly zero in 2019.
- Global Expectations for Al's Role: Al is expected to augment and automate jobs. 61% of respondents expect augmentation, while 51% expect automation.

In a historic milestone, India and United Kingdom (UK) successfully concluded Free Trade Agreement (FTA)

It is a **comprehensive** deal marking the culmination of around 3 year-long negotiation process. **Key Highlights of the India-UK FTA**

- Tariff Elimination: On about 99% of the tariff lines covering almost 100% of the trade value, would benefit India.
 Currently, bilateral trade stands at about USD 60 billion.
- Ease the Mobility of Professionals: Including Investors, Intra-Corporate Transferees including their partners/dependent children with right to work; Independent Professionals, etc.
- Double Contribution Convention: Provide exemption for Indian workers temporarily in UK and their employers from paying social security contributions in the UK for three years.
- Opportunities for Talented and Skilled Youth: To gain from UK's digitally delivered services and advanced digital infrastructure.
- Export opportunities: For sectors such as textiles, marine products, leather, footwear, engineering goods, auto parts, organic chemicals, etc. increasing their competitiveness.
- Benefit Services: Like IT/ITeS, financial services, etc., through new opportunities and jobs.
- Others: Address Non-tariff barriers, promote good regulatory practices, etc.

About FTA

- Meaning: Agreement between country(s) or regional blocs to reduce or eliminate trade barriers and enhance trade.
- Currently, India has FTA with Japan, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Singapore, ASEAN, Malaysia, etc.
- Scope: Normally covers trade in goods/services but can also cover intellectual property rights (IPs), investment, government procurement and competition policy, etc.

ISRO Moves Gaganyaan Mission to First Quarter of 2027

The successful completion of Test Vehicle Abort Mission-1 (TV-D1) Mission and the first uncrewed Test Vehicle Abort Mission laid a strong foundation for the upcoming test schedule.

- > The second Test Vehicle Mission (TV-D2) will be followed by the uncrewed orbital flights of Gaganyaan.
- Gynoid (female robot) Vyommitra will undertake the first uncrewed mission of Gaganyaan.

About Gaganyaan Mission


- Objectives: Demonstrate India's human spaceflight capability by launching crew of 3 members to an orbit of 400 km (Low Earth Orbit) for a 3 days mission and bring them back safely to earth, by landing in Indian sea waters.
- **Components of the Gaganyaan Mission**
 - The Launch Vehicle Mark-3 (LVM-3): Formerly known as the GSLV Mk-III, it is a three-stage rocket with:
 - First stage: Two solid-fuel boosters strapped to the rocket core.
 - Second stage: Powered by two liquid-fuelled, clustered Vikas 2 engines.
 - Third stage: Equipped with the CE-20 indigenous cryogenic engine, using liquid hydrogen and liquid oxygen as fuel and oxidiser, respectively.
 - The Orbital Module: It weighs 8.2 tonnes and is the object launched into low Earth orbit by the LVM-3 rocket (See image). It € consists of two main parts:

The Crew Module

- Houses up to three astronauts for a week. >
- Equipped with parachutes for controlled > descent upon re-entry.
- Includes an Environmental Control and Life 3 Support System (ECLSS) for temperature, air quality, waste, and fire management.
- Features a crew escape system for astronaut > safety in case of ascent malfunction.

Service Module:

- Provides propulsion to raise the orbital 2 module's altitude post-separation.
- Propels the module back towards Earth.




Global Network of Age-friendly Cities and Communities (GNAFCC)

About Piezoelectric Effect

- Piezoelectric Effect is the ability of certain materials to generate an electric charge in response to applied mechanical stress.
- The word Piezoelectric is derived from "piezo", which is Greek for "push".
- The piezoelectric effect is reversible: Materials generating electricity under stress also generate stress when exposed to an electric field
- Piezoelectric Materials: Berlinite, cane sugar, quartz, Rochelle salt, topaz, and bone.

About Vesak Day



Recently, a team of International scientists mapped the genome of the Saola, often called the "Asian unicorn."

About Saola

- Habitat and Distribution: Mist-covered evergreen forests of the Annamite Mountains along the Vietnam-Laos border.
- Features: Two parallel horns with sharp ends (20 inches long on both male and female), cousin of cattle, resemble an antelope.
 - White markings on face and large glands on the muzzle probably to mark their territory or attract mates.
- Conservation Status: IUCN (Critically Endangered).

Multi-Influence Ground Mine (MIGM)

The Indian Navy and DRDO (Defence Research and Development Organisation) successfully tested the indigenously developed MIGM. About MIGM

- Advanced underwater naval mine designed to enhance the Indian Navy's capabilities against modern stealth ships and submarines.
- Designed and Developed by: Naval Science and Technological Laboratory (NSTL) under DRDO.
- Features:
 - It uses multiple sensors to detect acoustic, magnetic, and pressure signals from marine vessels.
 - € It has built-in electronics with processors to process data and trigger appropriate actions.
 - It is deployable from ships, submarines etc.

National Archives of India (NAI)

NAI has digitised more than 10 crore pages of historic documents. About NAI

- Genesis: 1891 at Calcutta (Kolkata) as the Imperial Records > Department.
- Ministry: Attached office of Ministry of Culture.
- Present Location: New Delhi (One Regional office: Bhopal; Three > Records Centres: Bhubaneswar, Jaipur and Puducherry).
- Purpose: Custodian of the records of enduring value including public records, private papers, oriental records, cartographic records and microfilms, etc.
- Headed by: Director General of Archives for the implementation of Public Records Act, 1993 and Public Records Rules, 1997.

Political Features

- Location: The Maldives is a tropical nation in the Indian Ocean composed of 26 coral atolls.

- **Eight Degree channel:** It separates the islands of Minicoy (India) and Maldives.

Geographical Features

- Formed entirely by coral reefs; no rivers or mountains. >
- Coral Reefs: Maldives has the world's seventh largest coral reef system, making up > about 3.14% of global reef area.
- The average **height of the islands does not exceed 1.7 m** above mean sea level.
